

An Important Update From Pyramid Hill CERT Team.

On behalf of the Pyramid Hill CERT (Community Emergency Response Team), we are announcing to the community that after eighteen years of community service, the current Team of volunteer members of Pyramid Hill CERT will be retiring from all roster and call out operations, and will cease operations effective as of the 31st December 2023.

The decision to finalise CERT operations was a collective agreement from all current members and with the support of our Peers from Ambulance Victoria. Personal reasons and a short fall in recruitment of new members over a long period of time were the main reasons for this decision.

As a Team of Volunteer First Responders, we have delivered emergency medical care to Pyramid Hill and surrounding communities and provided much needed support to patients and their families, with the aim in making a difference to people's life and their health outcomes. We have been able to achieve this through the availability, dedication, and having high expectations from our past and current volunteer First Responders.

We have gained advanced medical skills and practical life skills to ensure patient care is met whilst waiting for an Ambulance to arrive.

With an endless list of people to thank, we would firstly like to acknowledge the ongoing support and guidance from Ambulance Victoria Loddon Campaspe Regional and Area Managers and Peers, Education Facilitators and attending Paramedic crews. And the quantity of training hours that was required to meet the skill set, protocol and procedures at the CERT Hall for Monday night Training during these years in operation.

Special thanks to the initial committee who first established the Pyramid Hill and District CERT Incorporation and made it all possible. To the generosity of donations past and more recently of which we are in discussions of items to benefit the community. Thank you.

But most importantly, to the past and current members who have contributed and volunteered their time in making this resource available. The biggest acknowledgement and thank you goes to our families for their patience, love and support throughout the years.

I have worn the Team Leader hat for the best part of twelve years of which I have had the fortunes of leading a group of caring, enthusiastic, dedicated and valuable people of which Pyramid Hill is so lucky to have. We have shared experiences on all levels during this time. In reference to both flood years and COVID-19 as examples of the highest dedication of volunteer service in helping people and providing much needed assistance and care to the communities.

Moving forward as we come to a close, we will take time to reflect on the past eighteen years.

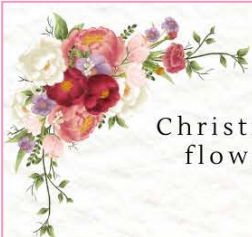

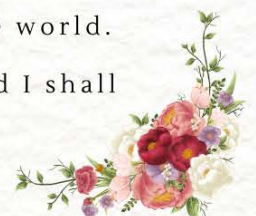

AV celebrates long-standing First Responder team

Ambulance Victoria (AV) acknowledges and thanks the dedicated volunteers from the Pyramid Hill Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), who are finishing up after 18 years of continued service.

Established in 2005, eight out of the 10 current volunteers were founding members of the Pyramid Hill CERT.

AV Loddon Mallee Director Regional and Clinical Operations, Matt McCrohan, said the team had played an important role in the health care of Pyramid Hill.

"Many of the Pyramid Hill CERT members are among the state's longest serving CERT volunteers," he said.

"As a team, they have shown exemplary dedication to caring for their community for almost two decades.

"I would like to personally thank the members of the CERT and wish them all the best for the future."

CERT Team Leader Sheridan Gunther said it was a difficult decision to step away, but a unanimous one from team members.

"It was a hard call, but people were just getting tired after 18 years and we weren't able to facilitate the roster as well as we'd like," she said.

"We've had such a great journey as a really united team, so it was important this decision to finish up was made ourselves as a collective.

"As Team Leader, you can only be as good as the team you're leading, and there could be no complaints at all about any of the members that we've ever had – they've just been a wonderful group of people.

"When I think of the team, I think of integrity and respect."

Ms Gunther thanked the team members' families, AV colleagues and the Pyramid Hill community for their support.

"I've met so many great people who have supported Pyramid Hill CERT since day dot," she said.

Ambulance Victoria will continue to respond to the area from surrounding branches at Cohuna, Kerang and Boort.

AV is adding a new automated external defibrillator to the town's centre and will increase our community education about the simple steps bystanders can take in the moments following cardiac arrest while an ambulance is on the way.

The Pyramid Hill CERT will officially cease operations on 31 December 2023.

Reminder - Christmas kerbside waste collection

Contract awarded for Pyramid Hill Community Centre Redevelopment

The contract for the Stage 1 redevelopment of the Pyramid Hill Community Centre has been awarded to Searle Brothers for \$2.9 million. The contract was awarded by Council at the November 2023 Council Meeting. Stage 1 construction is expected to commence in February 2024, with a conservative build scheduled for completion mid-2025, subject to material supply and inclement weather.

The stage will include construction of: *allied health wing to accommodate Northern District Community Health and Maternal Child Health services, senior citizen's room, upgraded toilet facilities, renovation of the current hall and kitchen, expansion of storage, improved car parking and access to the building*

The awarding of the contract for Stage 1 of the project is a significant milestone and a wonderful step forward for the construction of this new community facility. On behalf of Council, I'd like to thank all those who contributed to getting the Pyramid Hill Community Centre to this Stage 1 construction – including the Pyramid Hill community, Northern District Community Health and a number of other community organisations. We look forward to working together with local organisations and the community on the first stage of this major redevelopment.

In 2019, Council received funding from the Victorian Government for the preparation of a master plan and feasibility study for the redevelopment of the existing Senior Citizens building into the Pyramid Hill Community Centre.

A \$200,000 contribution was allocated to the project through Council's 2021/22 annual budget process to support the design component of the project. In 2021, Council received funding through the Victorian

Government's Regional Infrastructure Fund for the development of detailed designs for all stages and funding for the construction of Stage 1. In November this year, Council endorsed a recommendation to contribute \$500,000 to the project through Council's Terrick Ward strategic fund.

Additionally, Loddon Shire Council was invited to submit a funding application to the Australian Government's Growing Regions Program to deliver the final stage of the Community Centre. The final stage includes the construction of a community wing to accommodate the Neighbourhood House, library services and a community gym, with further parking included. The outcome of this funding submission will be announced around March/April 2024 and if successful, will enable Council to deliver the project in its entirety.

Council allocates \$1 million towards Inglewood Streetscape project

Loddon Shire Councillors have allocated \$1 million from the Strategic Fund for the detailed design and costing of the Inglewood Streetscape project. It will also provide seed funding towards future funding applications. Councillors allocated the funds at the November Council Meeting, following consideration of the report and detailed Project Management Plan.

The Inglewood Streetscape Project aims to enhance the visual appeal, functionality, safety and cultural significance of the streetscape in Inglewood. The project will consider various elements, including: *Beautification, kerb and channel improvements, footpaths, underground power installation, greening initiatives, traffic calming, pedestrian safety enhancements, overall amenity improvement, place-making, integration of public art, heritage walking trails*

In reiterating the words of Council's CEO Lincoln Fitzgerald at the November Meeting, the Inglewood Streetscape project is a real credit to the community. There has been a huge amount of work undertaken and contributed by the community to develop a concept masterplan for the streetscape. Additionally, they have looked at different components and different ways the project could be broken down to ensure a deliverable project for a range of budgets. On behalf of Council, I'd like to thank the Inglewood community and Inglewood Development and Tourism Committee on their outstanding efforts on the project so far.

The allocation of this funding by Council will now allow this project to become shovel ready, meaning Council will be able to seek funding opportunities – be they government or philanthropic, to help deliver this project.
