CO-ORDINATOR CATCH UP

Hello Neighbours

You all might have got the idea that I have been pretty fond of Peggy Cameron. It is with some sadness that I share that our little guerilla gardener, our lemon tree and crepe myrtle philanthropist - has died this last week.

When we first met, we talked about her garden, and her family. She found out my favourite flowers were orchids. I had spent so much money on orchids while locked up at home during Covid times. 99% of them had died, I am useless when it comes to growing flowers. She couldn't believe me, growing orchids was as simple as neglect and a bit of water to her.

From our first meeting, she would bring me a weekly flower. Something she had grown, an orchid stem or a rose when they were in season. Always magnificent. Even when the flowers were staggeringly perfect and wonderful - she'd hand them over with a '*Ohh.... It's not much..*' Imagine that readers, being so new to town, and an almost 100 year old neighbour remembering to bring you a flower or two to start your week? Of course I was going to love my new little friend to the moon and back.

A photograph I shared with an orchid group I had joined, of her fancy wedding anniversary cattleya and the cymbidium she had staked with an old piece of stocking, rated over 300 likes on Facebook. I kept her up to date with the comments and requests for growing advice from people all over the world.

As the months wore on, it became clear that our short conversations were because she rarely wore her hearing aids rather than because we had run out of things to say. The visits were short, but the flowers kept coming when she could. If not flowers, then chocolates, biscuits that someone had gifted to her. She was generous with me. I saw the ipad images of the new babies, including the grand-baby-dog who has better manners than I have.

One of my favourite memories of Peg, I actually don't even know if she knew about it. I looked out from my desk one day during our flood emergency last year, and Peg's walker was parked under a tree out the front of the Neighbourhood House. It looked for all the life, that she had just been walking along and decided to climb the tree.

I posted '*I think Peg's been abducted*' on our facebook page. There were hilarious comments about checking up the tree, that she'd gone to higher ground to escape the floods.. Then there were Peg sightings later in the day.

I don't know but seeing her walk around the town was somehow a sign that we were alright.

I've missed her these past few months, while she has been living in Cohuna. It's a different grief when someone dies at a grand age. But there is a tiny tear in the universe nonetheless. I'll be reminded of her when I see orchids and abandoned walkers. We will have a little celebration of Peggy's life on Friday 24th November in the Memorial Hall, Pyramid Hill at 1.30pm for those who can't make it to Eaglehawk for the funeral.





Farewell Pyramid Hill and Thankyou




Marj, along with her family Tom, Brian, Gary, Paul and Mike and their families would like to thank the people of Pyramid for their care and thoughtfulness over many years.





BOWLS NOTES



"I'd also like to thank Cr Dan Straub for his time as Mayor for the past two years," Cr Holt added.


"Cr Straub saw us through a difficult time in our Shire during the 2023 October floods and subsequent recovery.


"Attendees were treated to fantastic live music from Sherri Parry while they enjoyed their lunch on the lawns of the Serpentine Recreation Reserve.
