The opening night event is Friday 17th February from 7pm until 10pm. An entry ticket for this event is \$15, which includes complementary drink and finger food, music and the announcement of the winners of the \$4100 in prizes. Most of the artwork will be for sale.



There's a great representation from local artists, but surprisingly there are a number of entries from as far as South Australia and Melbourne. There has been a big response from youth, and hopefully this start in the art competition arena will provide them a lot of benefits in their future art pursuits. Paul Haw will also be presenting a display of Aboriginal artefacts from the district around Boort.

This week has been all systems go with receiving the last of the artworks, and taking delivery of the display screens on Monday. Tuesday has been focused on installing the screens, ready for the art to go up on the walls in preparation for judging by renowned artist Geoff Paynter. On Friday local art-loving volunteers will be dressing the hall and getting the food prepared for the Opening event.

The Art Competition had to be re-scheduled from the original October date, but the small organising committee were quick to set a new date, and kept artists informed the whole way. It's a terrifically huge job, but the small committee lead by Anne Grogan and Terry Wood have done the hard work to ensure our first ever Pyramid Hill Art Competition will be a success!

The exhibition can be viewed Saturday and Sunday 10am-4pm, and Monday to Thursday from 10am-3pm.

I am not sure if you have noticed, but we are cultivating a dried arrangement of a garden out the front of the House. Farming some spiders. Possibly harboring some lizard families and snake mates. We have to regularly clear tumbleweeds from the foyer of the House. Not quite tumbleweeds. Its that spidery, spiky snowflake grass that rolls about. What is it called? There are a lot of great native plants in our garden [some, admittedly are dead - but many are alive] which have served a terrific purpose, however at times have become so overgrown that we can't see Peg if she walks between them. Actually Peg can't push her walker past them when they get too healthy and this is the reason we are getting rid of the Eremophila and the other natives. If you have any interest in them, please let me know and we will try and save them for you to plant in your garden!

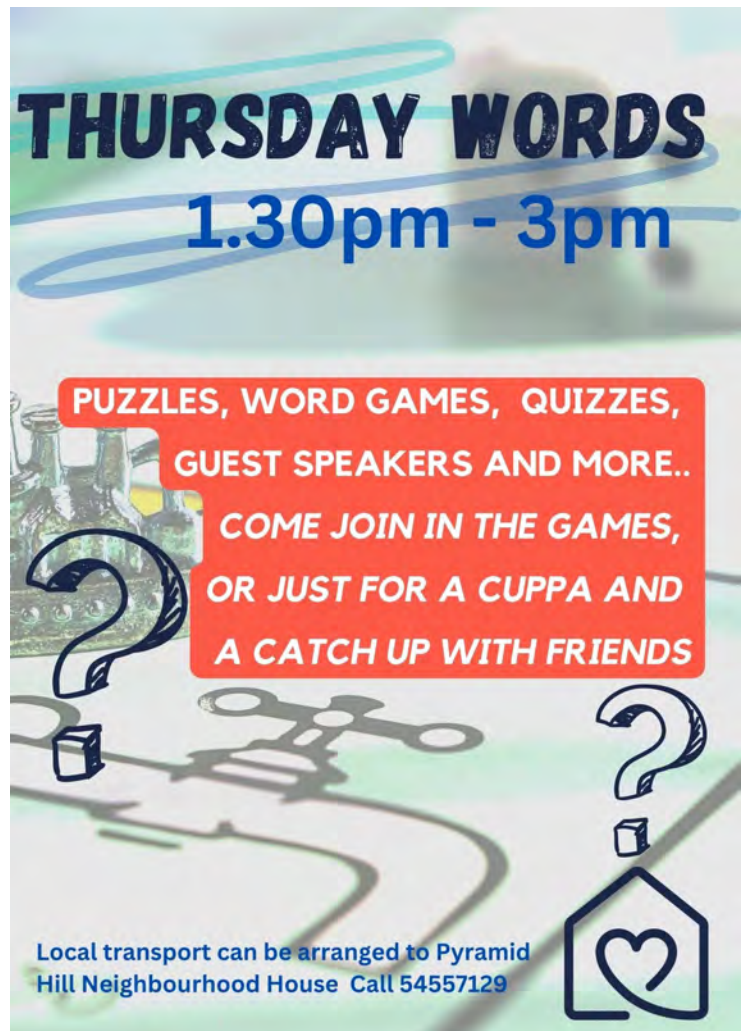
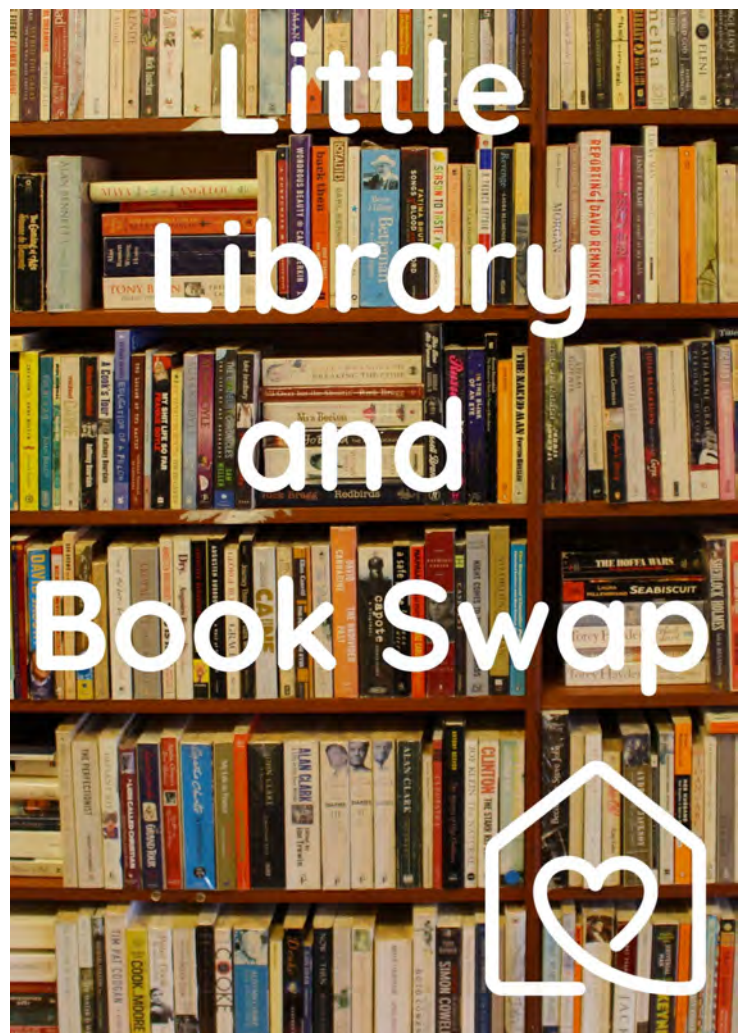

Capturing the flood damage

Plenty of work remains in repairing all the damage to our road network.

Council has had a team inspecting roads and capturing the damage in line with the State Government's Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements. This fund is there to help councils to restore its essential infrastructure such as roads after events such as the October floods.

To date the following repairs have been identified:

- 117 culvert repairs or replacements
- 56 floodway repairs
- 1 bridge replacement
- 273 km of gravel road re-sheets



- 47 km of unsealed road shoulders to replace
- 14.25 km of sealed road to be rebuilt

Approximately 95 per cent of the network has been assessed and as the data is reviewed over the coming weeks, the damage tally will grow.

Some damage assessments have been postponed so the impacts from harvest traffic on flood-affected roads is captured.

There has also been a need to reassess some roads as the damage has grown over time as traffic has travelled over them.

To put the situation that Council finds itself in perspective – Council's total road expenditure in the 2022-2023 Budget is \$6.7 million. The estimated repair bill for the flood damage to Council's road assets is approximately \$60 million.

Reporting issues with roads

If community members have an issue they would like to report they can contact Council directly.

Council takes its responsibility to provide a safe road network seriously and appreciates the community's feedback. Council has designated staff who are responsible for taking these enquires and ensuring that they are followed up.

If you encounter an issue or wish to make a complaint about one of Council's roads or any other Council matter, you can contact the team on (03) 5494 1200.

Issues can also be lodged via Council's website at www.loddon.vic.gov.au and clicking on "Report an issue".

Council also operates an after-hours service for urgent road issues, this is also accessed through the 5494 1200 phone number.

There are several roads in Loddon Shire that are the responsibility of Regional Roads Victoria (previously VicRoads). These include the highways and major connecting routes.

Issues on these roads can be reported to Regional Roads Victoria on 133 778.
