



PROGRESS ASSOCIATION

ISSUE 7 FRI 26 1982

On the 16th of this month, the Progress Association held its Annual General Meeting.

This week we present the Presidents report. In two weeks we will print details of the general meeting as well as results of some of the latest endeavours of the Association.

It is with pleasure that I present my report on the activities of the Pyramid Hill District Progress Association for the 1981-82 year.

The past year has not seen a great deal in the way of new initiatives proposed by this Association. Our activities have been focused on the continuation on endeavours of a long term nature, such as industry, town drainage and salinity, and also in investigation of various proposals on recommendation which would affect this community.

Our main concern at the moment is in regard to the recommendation of the Public Bodies Review Committee that the control of the Pyramid Hill Urban Water Supply be transferred from the S.R.W.S.C. to a proposed Gordon Water Board, which would be responsible for the Urban Water Supply at both Pyramid Hill and Boort. This proposal would seem to have no advantages at all to the township of Pyramid Hill, and many disadvantages are immediately apparent; not the least of these being the difficulty of adequate local representation, and the probability of greatly increased charges. This Progress Association has made strong representation against the proposal, and is pleased to note the support of Gordon Shire Council.

Other matters of importance:

INDUSTRY

The on going efforts to attract industry to the disused Butter Factory have not as yet shown visible signs of success. However, negotiations and promotion are continuing and we are hopeful of eventual success. We are indebted to the members of the Development Committee for their endeavours.

AIR STRIP

At the time of the last Annual report the air strip was virtually completed. It has now been handed over to Gordon Shire Council.

LOW RENTAL HOUSING

This Progress Association has made representation to the Minister for Housing for the installation of reverse cycle

air conditioning for the Low Rental Flats.

There has been little alteration in the position regarding town drainage and sewerage, of the proposed salinity basins during the past year.

VIC RAIL

This association continues to make representation to Vic Rail. Our efforts to have the Passenger time table altered to enable travel to and from Bendigo for business or medical appointments, have not been successful as yet. It is pleasing to note, however, that there is no thought of discontinuing the Passenger trains stop at Pyramid. Negotiations between Shire Council and Vic Rail for the purchase of the stock yards appear to have reached stalemate.

TELECOM AUSTRALIA

As reported last year, little improvement can be expected in telephone service prior to the change over to automatic exchange. This work has commenced and we look forward to change over later this year.

MOTOR CYCLE RALLY

The Progress Association acted as sponsors of a Motor Cycle Rally run by the Ducatti Owners Motor Cycle Club. This rally which was held on the property of Mr. Graeme Stevens was attended by approx. 300 enthusiasts. The conduct of the visitors was exemplary, and the rally was a great success as a promotional exercise for our district.

BEAUTIFICATION OF BULLOCK CREEK

The trees which were planted in the Spring of 1980 are doing well. We are indebted to the Gordon Shire for arranging the replanting of those that died and for maintenance and watering. We should now consider implementing stage two of this project this year.

Membership and attendance has been stable but is cause for some concern. Our efforts to increase membership by representation from local organisations met with little success. We must concentrate on efforts to increase our membership in order to be representative of the whole community, as I believe that this is at present a limiting factor in our effectiveness as a Progress Association.

Walsh says our flood victims must make their voices heard at inquiry

Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains, Peter Wash, is urging locals to make their voices heard at a Victorian Parliamentary inquiry into the 2022 floods. Being heard is just the start on the road to recovery and the campaign to much better prepare the region, and the state, against future flood events.

The inquiry will consider Victoria's preparedness and response to the floods and will look at things such as the flood mitigation infrastructure, government policy and systems to warn the public.

The inquiry will be taking submissions and it is important people in his electorate affected by the floods have their say and get their opinions on the record.

"Unfortunately there were many residents, too many residents, across my electorate impacted by the floods, and I encourage those people to have their say on what worked, and what could be improved on in case we face a similar situation in the future," Mr Walsh said.

People who have experienced the floods firsthand are in the best position to make sure we are more prepared for the future and need to be part of this major government inquiry.

Time to register your pets

Cat and dog registration time has rolled around again, and renewal notices will be arriving in pet owners' mail boxes in the coming weeks.

The simple fact is if a cat or dog isn't micro-chipped and registered they cannot be identified and reunited with their owner.

In the best interests of your pet, your family and the community, please ensure your registration renewal is paid by the due date.

Every dog and cat over the age of three months must be registered. Owners of dogs and cats being registered for the first time with Council are required to provide evidence that their pet has a microchip.

If you have an unregistered pet in your care, please take this opportunity to contact Council and rectify the situation as soon as possible, without fear of penalty.
