MINCHA WEST PREMIERS

It was fifth time lucky for Mincha West who have upset the red hot favourites and premiers of the last 4 years Calivil North; 100 games to 93 on Saturday at the Dingee lawn courts.

The two combatants had played off in the previous 4 Grand Finals with Calivil North waltzing to victory each year quite comfortably by margins of 45, 21, 36 and 24 games respectively. An underMANNed Mincha West gave themselves little chance of reversing the trend from previous years and instead focused more on the end of season party and having fun on the day.

Played in absolutely perfect weather conditions in a competitive but respectful manner plenty of laughs were had from each side of the net, this was replaced with engaged silence as the upset result seemed a probability with the last mixed set

on the court the equation was simple Calivil North pair Daniel Rogers and Ava Maxted had to defeat Peter Gargan and Meg Stewart from Mincha West 7-4 to tie the result, however Pete and Meg had other ideas putting an exclamation mark on the result winning the set 7-3.

After failing to deliver in previous years the strong Mincha West Mens side finally came to the party winning all six sets. Veterans Colin Mann and Vaughan Herrick leading the way in the bottom section instrumental in the overall 42 to 26 game result. However, it was the Ladies section where the upset result stemmed from. The Calivil North ladies have been dominant for the best part of 4 decades having been the backbone of 26 premierships in last 36 Years. The Mincha West ladies were able to claim 2 sets as well as 2 tiebreakers against the more fancied opposition, in what was a solid team effort a losing margin of only 7 games in the ladies exceeded all expectations and left the overall scores at 72 to 63 with Mincha West enjoying a 9 game lead going into the mixed sets.

Vaughan Herrick and Jed Stewart increased the margin to 14 however Calivil North quickly hit back reducing the margin to 1 game with 3 sets left on court. Don Stewart and Tina Prout increased the margin back to 4 games with a 7-4 victory, James Ritchie and Jeannie Wagner managed 6 games against the highly fancied Maxted/Strachan combination leaving Peter and Meg to bring home the title.






BAW BAW CAMP



While staying at the camp students will find they have work to do in the preparation of meal, washing up, and a daily clean-up.
