

FOOTBALL NOTES

It was good to bounce back after lean round 4 results, with the Bulldogs winning the Seniors and Reserves football, but losing a competitive Thirds clash when we hosted Bridgewater.

The visitors led for all of the Thirds' game, but this week, on their home turf, the young 'Dogs were able to keep the scoreboard ticking over, and although the final margin was more than 10 goals, there were many passages of play and individual efforts that would have pleased coach Bryden and team manager Luke. Four goalkickers for the game was a "plus" and with great leadership displayed by Connor McCoy (Pyramid Hill Butchery Award), Lewis Stubbs (Ant Free Shearing Award), Tony Fernandez (Wizartry Signs Award), Blake Gibson (President's Award) and Xavier Emmerson (Good Sports Award), there is plenty to look forward to as the season progresses. Others to put together 4 tough quarters included Riley Hutton, Kobi Manton and Harley Barnett.

Over the past two weeks the Reserves have been hit hard with injuries and players being required for Senior duties. We faced Bridgewater with no fewer than 12 regulars missing. Thanks to the former players who responded to the "SOS", and their commitment to the red, white and blue. A six-point quarter time deficit had been slightly reduced by the main change, but the "premiership quarter" saw the game decided. Five goals to one helped set up what would be a meritorious 5 goal victory. Greg "Sticky Fingers" Quinn marked everything that came his way and was a deserved "Pony Award" winner. A 4-quarter running effort on the wing saw Connor Gibbins take home the "Victoria Hotel" Award, and a typical in-and-under effort from Tom Nunn saw the "National Hotel" Award go his way. Ward boundary review for Loddon Shire

The Local Government Minister has requested a ward boundary review for Loddon Shire before the October 2024 Council elections. The review will consider if the Council has an appropriate number of councillors and if it should be one large unsubdivided area or subdivided into wards. They also consider research/analysis, voter growth or decline over time and public submissions. A total of 39 local councils must have their electoral structure reviewed, and residents can have their say. The reviews will be conducted in three rounds within the next 18 months.

Council Meeting outcomes

Council has resolved to seek feedback from the community on its draft 2023/24 Budget after consideration of the document at the April Council meeting.

The Loddon Shire Council draft 2022/23 Budget sees continuation of a strong cash position, with no new borrowings. It includes a commitment to the Community Planning program, as well as projects and initiatives included in Council's various strategic plans.

The draft budget includes a rate increase of 3.5% – in line with the Victorian Government's Rate Capping Policy.

The draft budget allocates a capital expenditure program of \$10.73 million, which includes \$5.53 million towards roads, \$1.33 million for parks and streetscapes, and \$750,000 for recreational, leisure and community facilities.

Additionally, the draft budget includes a \$200,000 allocation for works associated with the Building Asset Management Plan and full funding of Council's ongoing commitment to community planning of \$750,000.

Waste service charges will increase by 3% per collection item, offsetting increases in the cost of kerbside waste and recycling disposal along with new licencing requirements. The cost of a 140-litre bin will increase to \$401 (from \$389) and a 240-litre bin to \$545 (from \$529). The cost for a 240-litre kerbside recycling bin will increase to \$151 (from \$147).

As the draft budget was developed during the recovery period of the 2022 major flooding events, the budget may change to respond to future flood relief and recovery efforts.

Together with the draft 2023/24 Budget, Council is also seeking community feedback on a draft Fees and Charges Schedule for 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024.

Feedback is open until 5pm Friday 19 May 2023.
