



FOOTBALL NOTES

Round 6 saw the Bulldogs travel to our closest neighbours, Mitiamo, and in sunny, Spring weather, were victorious in 2 of the 3 football games.

The Under 18's, running out for the third week in a row, put on a very spirited display and were able to keep the scoreboard ticking over against the "Rams". The final margin was a comfortable one for the "Rams", but 20 scoring shots by the 'Dogs, for eight goals, was a pleasing result. A few shots on goal went astray early, but the momentum being gained in each outing is evident, and coaching staff, parents and Bulldogs' members should be happy with the on-field endeavour. Lewis Stubbs (6 goals) was again the instigator of many attacking moves, and took home the "Pyramid Hill Butchers" award. Blake Gibson was again in everything also, and won the "Ant Free Shearing" award. He was also rewarded with a place on the bench for the "Ressies" for his efforts. The "Good Sports" award went to Connor McCoy, Xavier Emmerson claimed the "President's" award, with Jacob Clough-Fidler pocketing the "Wizartry Signs" award.

The Reserves were eventually able to claim the points over the "Super Roos", but after a slick start, that contrasted with a goalless third term, the win was one that required a sustained final stanza. The "Bulldogs" opened at a blistering pace and 5 goals to 2 in the "opener" set up what would be the 4th win of the season. Rowan Pollock's 5 goals took him to 17 for the season, and with the returning Coen Cooper, and the consistent Greg Quinn both nailing 2 goals, the Bulldogs proved too strong for a persistent and energetic Mitiamo. The key to the win was the 4-Quarter efforts of Tom Walker (Pony Award), Rylan Delamere (National Hotel Award), and Jason Carroll (Victoria Hotel Award). Top defensive efforts from this trio resulted in non-stop forward forays for the 'Dogs and eventually the points were secured. Nathan Moon (Good Sports Award) was his usual high-pressure presence. Others that put their bodies on the line included Max Bone, Mark Swiney, Matt Carroll, Troy Woolhouse and Dave Mann.

The Seniors were able to secure their biggest win of the season, and in doing so impressed the coaches' bench with their consistent 4-quarter output. Being able to keep the scoreboard operators busy from "go to whoa" meant the hosts were consistently on the back foot and unable to settle into any rhythm of their own. Twelve individual goalkickers was also another "plus", with eight of those being multiple scorers. Key factors in the win were Dylan Collis, 3 goals and the "Victoria Hotel Award", and skipper Steven Gunther who drilled 4 goals and claimed the "National Hotel Award". They were supported by the energetic Brodie Carroll, Zac Alford and Billy Micevski. The on-ball and mid-field brigade were pivotal to the win. Others to stand out included rebounding defender Zac Dingwall, linkman Jesse Sheahan and ruck/forward Tom Brennan.

We travel to Maiden Gully/YCW for Round 7 and are hopeful of maintaining the Bulldog winning formular. Players, members and supporters are reminded of the "Club Ball" after the Round 8 home clash with Inglewood.


