ASSISTANCE FOR HANDICAPPED

The Department of Social Security has launched a special information program on the handicapped child's allowance, Mr. John Crommie of the Department's Swan Hill Office said yesterday.

"We are aware that throughout Victoria there are a number of families with handicapped children who could be eligible to receive this payment but, for one reason or another, have not applied for it", Mr. Crommie said.

"We want to make sure that these families become aware of the handicapped child's allowance and how to apply for it. The Department has produced a new handicapped child's allowance poster to increase community awareness of this assistance. Copies have been distributed to local agencies which may have contact with handicapped children or their families. Individuals or organisations can obtain copies of this poster from our office at 337 Campbell Street, telephone 32 4526", he said.

A handicapped child's allowance may be paid to a parent or guardian of a mentally or physically disabled child under 16 years or a dependant full-time student aged 16 to 24 years, if the student is not receiving an invalid pension.

The purpose of the payment is to ease the burden which these children can place on a family,

therefore encouraging the care of such children at home rather than in an institution. It is still available if the child attends a day care centre or a special day school.

The allowance is \$73 per month for a severely handicapped child, and is not subject to an income test. A child in this category requires constant care and attention either permanently or for an extended period.

However, for a substantially handicapped child who needs marginally less care and attention the payment is up to \$73 a month, depending on both the family's income and the

additional costs involved with caring for the child.

"Part A" of the application has to be completed by the person receiving a family allowance for the child concerned. "Part B" must be filled in by a medical practitioner attached to a hospital or clinic, or a specialist or general practitioner who has recently been involved in the treatment or supervision of the child's disability.

If a claim for this allowance is rejected, an appeal can be lodged against the Department's decision and will be considered by an independent medical panel.

Irrigators in the Dingee, Calivil and Tragowel Plains Irrigation Areas are advised that all irrigation channels will be drained of water during the winter period where possible.



Trials Commence

Advanced Energy Tech have commenced Phase One of their trials at their Research, Development and Demonstration Facility in Pyramid Hill. The first feedstock trials commenced in December 2022, starting with Olive Pit.

As part of the trials, Advanced Energy Tech are committed to complying with environmental legislation and using the learnings from the trials to improve business sustainability.

Advanced Energy Tech has engaged the services of EnviroRisk to conduct noise monitoring and to assist with sampling requirements. Initial noise monitoring findings display compliant levels.

The sampling process includes checking the feedstock, in this case Olive Pit, prior to processing, the char after the process, and water sampling. All samples are being assessed in a Melbourne based laboratory. Continuous sampling will be conducted, and results will be scrutinised to ensure the data assists with future trials and how to get the best result possible. Noise monitoring and sampling reports will form part of a formal report Advanced Energy Tech will provide to the Environmental Protection Agency.

Overall, it has been a positive start to the trials. As expected with RD&D, learnings have already been made and will continue to throughout each of the trials.
