



Life Membership for Lionel

At the most recent AGM of the PHBC the Board of Management made the decision to confer Lionel Mann with Life Membership in recognition of, and reward for, his substantial voluntary and exceptional meritorious service. His commitment and contribution has impacted the ongoing success and viability of the Pyramid Hill Bowling Club over a prolonged period of time.

In the compilation of Lionel's input to the Club his list accomplishments are evidence that his work sets him apart from others and his service is considered to be above and beyond that which might be expected from any member.

Lionel's association with the Club began approximately twenty years ago when he first got a taste for the sport through playing at a social level in the Night Bowls competition which involved clubs from Serpentine, Dingee and Calivil. Lionel soon became enthused about the sport and started playing Pennant bowls which required a more serious application and dedication. Early on he showed that he had great talent and soon developed a reputation as being skillful and an opponent not to be reckoned with.

At Club level, Lionel has played in several Pennant team Premierships Grand-finals with the good fortune to be Runner-up three times but the ultimate Premiership has so far eluded him. At a personal level, Lionel has had far greater success. Seven times he has won the PHBC Club Singles Championship, the most recent being in the past season when he won the Men's Singles Championship while his wife, Jean, won the Ladies' Singles Championship. Lionel marks this as one of his playing highlights; it is not a common occurrence for a husband and wife to jointly win Club Championships. It was certainly an achievement the whole Club rejoiced in. The Club Championships entitle the players to go on to contest other



Club Champions in the Playing Area and, on one occasion, Lionel was Runner-up to the Champion of Champions being narrowly beaten in that match. Other significant achievements as a player include winning the State Mixed Pairs for the Northern District (2014-15) when he teamed with Marie Scott and again these two won the Murray Mallee Regional Mixed Pairs in 2015-16. Lionel teamed with Fred Schmidt, Laurie Forde and good team mate Andy Nicholson to win the Champion of Champion Fours in 2015-16. Lionel is recognized throughout the district as a skilled player with high principals of good sportsmanship. He is well known and highly respected.

Putting aside his player achievements, Lionel's commitment to the PHBC in many operational roles is the predominant reason for his nomination to Life Membership. Over the years, Lionel held the position of Club Secretary of the Men's Board for two years prior to the Men's and Ladies' Boards amalgamating into one universal Board of Management. Lionel took on the role of Treasurer in 2008 and has held this position since that time – a period of fifteen years and still continuing. Included in his role as Treasurer has been the responsibility of seeking valuable and copious sponsorship for the Club which has enabled the Club to flourish prosperously. He has held positions of League Delegate, Team Selector, Tournament Secretary, Match Committee man and has his RSA which entitles him to responsibly serve in the Club bar. He took a leading role in running Barefoot Bowls to encourage others to experience bowls as a fun and social sport, and has contributed many, many hours to the club during working bees or just going along to ensure things are in readiness for play or to ensure the bowling facility is well maintained.

SICKNESS PAYMENTS

Wasn't it surprising to read the figures issued recently by the Australian Bureau of Statistics that showed nearly half of the population is suffering from some form of chronic illness?

In this survey, about 6.2 million people were classified as being chronically ill, with the common illnesses being arthritis, hay fever, high blood pressure, eczema, migraine, bronchitis, asthma, varicose veins and heart disease.

These figures are not reflected, however, in the latest sickness benefit statistics from the Commonwealth Department of Social Security. Mr. John Crommie of the Department's Swan Hill Regional office said yesterday that, at present, approximately 51,000 Australians receive this payment, of whom 11,500 live in Victoria.

Sickness benefit is available to men aged 16 to 64 and women aged 16 to 59 who suffer a loss of income because illness or injury temporarily prevents them from working.

Mr. Crommie said that a claimant will not be paid until he or she has been offwork for at least 7 days.

A claimant must also have lived in Australia for at least 12 months or intend to remain permanently. A medical certificate must be lodged in conjunction with a sickness benefit application showing the date on which he or she is likely to return to work.

Eligibility also depends on income test, and the Department considers such income as sick pay, workers' compensation, a spouse's wage, interest from

savings, rent from property or dividends from shares and debentures. A war pension does not affect sickness benefit if it is paid for a different illness or injury.

A single person aged 16 or 17 with at least one parent in Australia will not have any entitlement if his or her gross weekly income exceeds \$57.50. A person in this age group with no parent in Australia will be ineligible for any sickness benefit when his or her gross weekly income exceeds \$64. A single person aged 18 or over will not have any entitlement when his or her gross weekly income exceeds \$102.15. A Married couple will be ineligible for any sickness benefit when their combined gross weekly incomes exceed \$151.60. These limits are higher when a claimant has a child or children under 16 years of age or a dependent full-time student or students up to 25 years of age.

The maximum rate of payment for a married couple is \$123.60 a week, while a single person aged 18 or over can receive up to \$74.15 a week. \$36.00 per week is the maximum rate for a single person aged 16 or 17. A dependant's allowance of \$10 a week is paid for each child under 16 or full-time student under 25.

If an application for sickness benefit is lodged within 13 weeks of the claimant becoming ill or being injured, the benefit can be back-dated to the start of the second week.


