FOOTBALL

After a tough day at the Office the previous week the Bulldogs 1s and 2s bounced back in emphatic fashion in their respective do-or-die Preliminary finals at Calivil. In ideal "cricket conditions" the Reserves hit the ground running. The scoreboard operator was kept busy in the opening stanza, and with accuracy a key factor in what would eventually be a 50-point victory, the 'Dogs effectively had the game won at the first change. The first quarter total was equal to what the Eagles would post for the match. Instrumental in setting up the all-the-way win were Jack Woodward at the stoppages, Ashton Dye with strong aerial work all over the ground, and Matt and Brad Moon across halfback. With the "Sherrin" regularly in the forward arc, elusive forward Dylan Lovell (4 goals) and League leading goalkicker Rowan Pollock (3 goals, season total 83), were able to capitalise. It was good to see 6 others hit the scoreboard as well, with an evenly spread load what is required in finals. After the opening term blitz the Eagles sought to limit the damage, and with a spare man in defence were able to temporarily halt the surge. To keep them goalless in the first half would have pleased the coaches' bench. The second half was an even affair on the scoreboard, but the Bulldogs basically controlled their back-half and kept the Eagles at arm's length. Youngsters Blake Gibson (1 goal) and Harry Goodes got the chance to display their talents, and had support from Mitch Gunther and Dylan Goulding who controlled respective wings, and ever-green Dave Mann at the stoppages. It was a top win and can hopefully set us up for the ultimate test today. Award winners were Matt Moon (Victoria Hotel), Jack Woodward (National Hotel) and Ashton Dye (Pony Award).

The coaches' bench would have been impressed with the ability to score more in the second half than the first and the fact that again they were multiple goalkickers; 10 in total. Thirty scoring shots to just 13 was testament to just how much of the game the 'Dogs controlled in the second half. The Awards went to both ends of the ground, with Tom McGregor (Victoria Hotel) rewarded for secure intercept marking and damage control in the back half, and Zach Alford (National Hotel) for non-stop forward half pressure and attack on the ball.

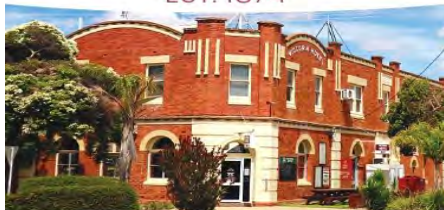

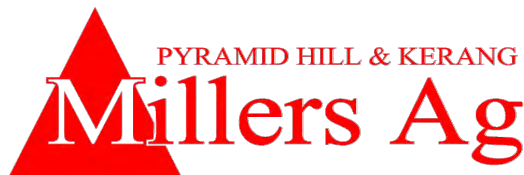
