

I did not meet Lloyd Mills, but I must say his reputation as a genuinely nice and uncomplicated man came through loud and clear from dozens of sources over the last few years. One of our most popular Press edition featured his wedding photo on the front cover. If you are into searching the web, stories of his service in the second world war and more come up from several sources. The Loddon Herald covered his birthday and death with stories in recent weeks. I wish his family the best of memories of a life well lived.

Dear Leigh McCahon, I remember meeting him over the first few months when I arrived in Pyramid Hill. He said he didn't want me to feel like he was trying to tell me what my job was, as he had so much history and experience with the House and previous Coordinators. He wanted me to find my feet, but offered any support he could. The last time I saw Leigh, I helped him with a tiny thing.. I connected his hearing-aid via audioloop to his mobile phone. He smiled the widest smile and told me that I had changed his life. He could now talk to his children on his mobile again. He told me '*We waited a long time for you to come along, and you were definitely the right choice.*'

This job has many rewards, but sometimes a particular moment in time, means more than the world. I will remember this moment with Leigh, his kindness and our friendship and remember that small quiet acts can sometimes mean the most to people.

My genuine love goes out to Beth, and her family, and to all the friends of Leigh that are missing him today.

On something considerably brighter, our Art Show opened to a generous crowd. I worked selling tickets and artworks on the opening night. I love the happy vibe that people have when they have made an artwork choice for themselves, or for a friend. Congratulations again, to all the team who have organised the exhibition and competition, the artists Kevin and Terry who ran workshops on Sunday, all the folks who cooked and served morning teas throughout the show. It really works like a machine, this show. All managed by volunteers. How lucky we are to have you all.


HEAT ILLNESS

- Heat Cramps

- Prioritise outside tasks to complete them in the morning if possible.
- Seek shade and wear protective clothing.
- Check in on vulnerable friends, neighbours, and family.
- Use air conditioning and fans where possible.
- Never leave children or animals in a parked car.

Loddon Shire Council ward boundary review

The Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) is reviewing the ward boundaries of Loddon Shire Council at the request of the Minister for Local Government and is seeking your input.

The preliminary report will be available and response submissions for the Loddon Shire Council review open on Wednesday 21 February. Submissions close at 5pm Wednesday 13 March 2024.

In your submission, you can also ask to speak at a public hearing.

At the end of the review, the VEC will make a final recommendation to the Minister for Local Government. Any changes to the ward boundaries of Loddon Shire Council following this review are expected to apply at the next local council elections.

Telstra switching off their 3G network on 30 June 2024

Back in 2019, Telstra announced they would be closing their 3G network, which you might also know as the Telstra Next G network. Doing so will allow Telstra to repurpose the 3G spectrum to offer better coverage and reliability on their 4G and 5G mobile network.

On 30 June 2024, Telstra will be switching off their 3G network. The 4G and 5G networks will be available instead and will offer an improved experience. This means if you have a 3G-compatible device, it will not work from 1 July 2024.

Please note: If you're using a medical device to monitor health such as medical alarms, security or other remote safety situations, and they're currently using the 3G 2100 MHz layer, please check for compatibility on accompanying paperwork from the manufacturer, and/or contact the provider of these devices to upgrade now.
