Meet Lizzie Boikos. Lizzie is our Community Programs coordinator and is running Pyramid Cares out of the Pyramid Hill Neighbourhood House. She has a background in education, libraries and developing community programs and ... she loves camels, a love fostered from running a camel dairy during covid! And ... making things, anything from food, craft, gardening, writing a trashy book for giggles and just creating for the fun of it.

Lizzie and her family (partner Simon and son Daemon) moved from Rochester to Pyramid Hill after the 2022 floods. They bought a house and Lizzie immediately started growing vegetables, the overflow she generously and consistently brings to the house. Eating mostly home produce, Lizzie's resourcefulness is ingenious. She's next trying to make zucchini flour as a gluten free alternative to use up the ones she hasn't already bottled, pickled or cooked.

Lizzie's focus on running Pyramid Cares comes from needing care herself. She lives with peripheral neuropathy (nerve damage in her hands and feet that gives chronic pain) and needs extra support to get through her day. She pays it forward by running Pyramid Cares, it's very close to her heart. The program is for people who want support, to gain some understanding, and to come together for a break. There are resources available for respite, travel, accommodation, mental health and more and she wants to connect carers to these.

A carer is anyone looking after someone. It can be you looking after a child, an elderly person, a friend or your neighbour. If you are assisting someone in their day to day life, then you are a carer.

Whatever your needs, the house will be operating as normal and we'd love to see you. Come say hi!


