

There were many individual highlights, including tackles, spoils and smotherers, but Harry Goodes' running goal from a centre clearance was as good as you would see anywhere. A repeat of the team spirit and endeavour will be rewarded at some stage during the season.

The Reserves G.F. The replay went as expected in terms of early pressure at the stoppages and constant physical harassment from both sides at all contests. Handling the early heat better the hosts skipped out to an early lead and at the first change had kicked 3 goals and kept the Bulldogs goalless. The pressure applied by the Panthers contributed to a number of turnovers and missed opportunities for the visitors. This was quickly turned around in the 2nd stanza however when, led by Mitch Gunther (Pony Award) and Harry Goodes (Victoria Hotel Award), the 'Dogs unleashed a series of forward forays based on a fast-flowing running game that saw an instant momentum swing.
