
At the end of last month we stopped our regular carer's gatherings [and yet the walking group continues!]. Thanks to Lizzie for all the work she has put in on that program.



With Book Week, the Lions Club Public Speaking Competition, the District Athletics Carnival and a Student Spirituality Day, the term will fly by.


Our major event for the term will be our participation in the annual 'Sandhurst Arts on Show' Festival at the end of term.

On Monday, Laura and Jess from Arts Alive spent the morning rehearsing our songs and dancing as we prepare for our performance at this exciting event.



FOOTBALL NOTES ROUND 13

The fog lifted in time for the Under 18's game but it took the boys a quarter to get themselves into full working mode. Before they knew it the hosts had a 4-goal lead and it was quarter time. Once the mojo was restored the Bulldogs fans were treated to a scintillating second term as Blake Gibson, Riley Hutton and Harry Goodes asserted themselves on the contest. Six goals to one saw the 'Dogs with a 1 goal lead at the main break. It was great to see the younger and smaller Bulldogs grow in confidence as the game wore on, and a handy buffer had been established at the final change. The opposition were able to win the final stanza, but in the end, it was a 3-point win to the "Pups", and made it their third win of the season. Harry Goodes, 5 goals, including a monster 50+ metre special, won the Victoria Hotel Pizza Award and Riley Hutton claimed the Pyramid Hill Butchers Award for his effort that was on display over 4 quarters. Blake Gibson was again the master of the intercept, with his steady and repelling work across halfback instrumental in ensuring things went out way in the final term. Blake was the Good Sports Award winner. James Hercott, Jacobi Mitchell and Lewis Stubbs, who worked tirelessly in the ruck, were also influential in a victory that meant the Club song was again belted out at full volume.

The Bulldogs reserves fielded a strong team and had their chances against a very handy Bridgewater line-up, but in the end had to settle for second. Five scoring shots for no goals meant despite the good second term the early deficit had actually been extended at the main break. Kaleb Quinn and Dutchy Holland were providing ample opportunities in the corridor and at stoppages but errant delivery into the forward line was repelled too easily. Mick Dundon, in his return game kicked a couple of goals and Dolf Reid and Greg Quinn presented well forward of the centre, but the big sticks could not be found. The 'Dogs finished well and won the final term, but despite having just one less scoring shot, went down by 16 points. The Victoria Hotel Award went to Kaleb Quinn for his 4 tireless quarters, and Brad Moon, at his repelling best across halfback, pocketed the National Hotel Award. Dutchy Holland claimed another Pony Award and Matt Moon won the

Good Sports Award. Throughout the game solid support was also provided by Glen James, Brad Driscoll, Tom Walker, Greg Quinn and Mick Dundon.

The senior clash was another highly anticipated contest, with the Bulldogs faithful keen to see if there was to be a letdown after the great win the previous outing. The ball was hot in the opening term and the hosts were full-on with pressure. The Bulldogs returned fire at the stoppages and an entertaining opening term saw the home team 7 points up, but a combined 3-goals only had been scored, such was the pressure. The 'Dogs gradually started to gain the ascendancy and as the game opened up it made for more goals; 9 in all for the second term. The home team notched 4, but the 5 goals to the 'Dogs was a sign of things to come. Led by Lachy Sidebottom and Tom Brennan in the

ruck, the ball movers and carriers for the Bulldogs came into the game with increasing frequency. Ben Knight, (Victoria Hotel Award), Seb Relouw (4 goals), Jack Burns (also 4 goals) were able to exert maximum influence. Tom McGregor, (National Hotel Award), was again the leader of the back-half, and received great assistance from Jack Timmins (Healthy Mates Award) and Dylan Morison. Zac Alford was, as usual, an energetic presence in the forward zone, and by game's end the 'Dogs bench was more than happy with 9 individual goal scorers. The second half saw two more 5-goal terms, and in keeping the hosts goalless in the final term, an 8-goal win, and second rung on the ladder resulted. Bulldog's fans, members and supporters are reminded that today's game is also the Major Sponsors Day, with the annual Goods and Services Auction to follow.
