Mr. Ian Bartels has lived his entire 86 years in the township of Pyramid Hill and has served his community through his work as an electrician, even following his official retirement – he is still fixing pumps and attending to electrical issues for sporting groups eg. Golf, Bowls, Mitchell Park.

Ian has volunteered his services and expertise in numerous ways over the years and is currently (or of recent times) quietly going about his day attending to various jobs not looking for thanks or gratitude and often at his own expense.

Some of these voluntary contributions are listed here:

- Mowing and watering the grounds of the former hospital and rest home, the cemetery and the gardens of local community members.
- Ensuring water supply is available for wildlife at the hill
- Keeping the Store clock going and adjusting the time until the recent refurbishment – this required some agility in scaling the vertical ladder as well as dealing with the electronics.
- Painting the exterior of the Anglican Church hall, and keeping the amenities tidy for all to use.
- Constructing the sign from previously used bowls at the Bowling Club entrance
- Being the go-to-guy to set up PA systems for various events in the town

Ian's previous involvement in the community included:

- Member and Life Member of Golf Club, original member (piper) in the Caledonian Pipe Band, Member of the Hospital Board
- Sporting involvement in football, golf and bowls
- Long standing church member of St Thomas' Anglican church and until recent times provided digitally acquired music for the hymns

As mentioned before, Ian's contributions to his local community have been numerous (probably way more than this list extends) and he has always gone about his day quietly, just doing what he sees needs doing or responding promptly to requests. He is a model citizen and deserves the accolades.















Discover cutting edge pulse agronomy at BCG Main Field Day

BCG's Main Field Day, set to take place in Nullawil on September 11, will showcase the latest advancements in pulse agronomy. Leading experts, Kelly Angel from BCG, Audrey Delahunty from Agriculture Victoria, Stuart Nagle from SARDI, and Jason Brand from Frontier Farming Systems, will present breakthroughs in pulse variety selection, disease management, and end-use strategies to enhance the role of pulses in farming systems.

"The dry season we've experienced in the region underscores the importance of yield stability in ensuring profitability when growing pulses in challenging conditions," says Kelly Angel, BCG Research and Extension Officer. "Newer pulse varieties are increasingly showing a yield advantage compared to older ones."

A highlight of the day will be the pulse super session, where experts will discuss new vetch varieties entering the market. The session will cover the various end uses of vetch—grazing, hay, brown manure, and grain—and their impact on subsequent crops. Understanding these legacy effects is key to optimising crop rotations and improving soil health.

BCG is currently investigating the performance of existing pulse varieties while also offering an exclusive preview of soon-to-be-released varieties. With both vetch and pulse experts on hand, growers will have the opportunity to ask pressing questions about the management of these crops. Given the early onset of severe *Ascochyta* blight in lentils across many areas in 2023, disease management will be another key focus of the day. Discussions will explore variety responses, resistance ratings, and the critical timing of product applications to manage diseases like *Ascochyta* blight and *Botrytis* grey mould effectively.

BCG's Main Field Day offers the latest in local agronomic research to farmers, agronomists, and advisors. In addition to pulse agronomy, the event will cover new cereal varieties, canola establishment, long coleoptile wheat, and disease management in wheat and barley.

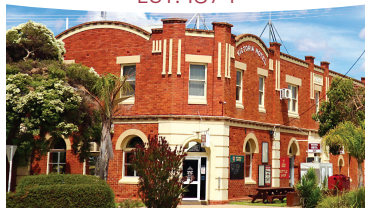

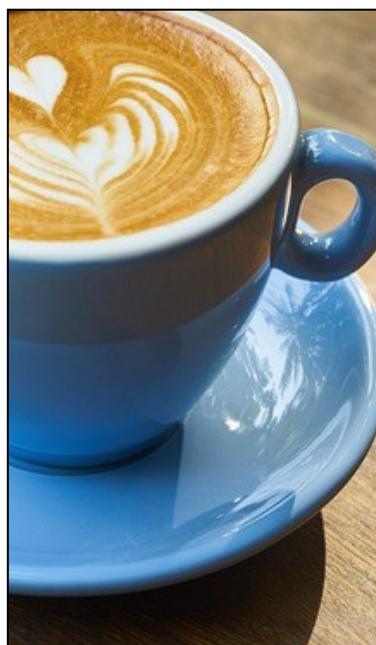

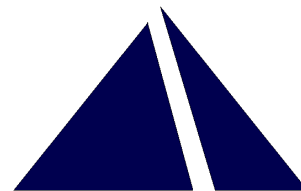

Loddon Shire Council has welcomed the tabling of the Victorian Legislative Council Environment and Planning Committee's Final Report for the Inquiry into the 2022 Flood Event in Victoria. Tabled in the Legislative Council on 30 July 2024, the report makes 90 findings and 73 recommendations, including improvements to flood governance arrangements and boosting resources for emergency services responding to events such as floods.

"The 2022 floods had a devastating impact on the Loddon Shire, causing widespread damage to infrastructure, agriculture, homes and the livelihoods of our residents," Loddon Shire Chief Executive Officer Lincoln Fitzgerald said.

"Council acknowledges the vital importance of the recommendations presented in the report, particularly those that address the unique challenges faced by rural communities like Loddon Shire.

"This includes around Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements; in particular that the Victorian and Federal governments work together to simplify the application process and that funding arrangements are not unduly burdensome.

"Cutting the red tape when it comes to applying for disaster recovery funding and management of funding, will help ensure councils like Loddon Shire are able to get out and start the recovery process as quickly as possible – including repairing crucial infrastructure such as local roads and bridges."

Other recommendations to be advocated by Council include those around long-term and dedicated mental health resources in flood-affected regions as well as funding and resourcing towards conducting and implementing up-to-date flood studies on a regular basis.

"Operational control is another important recommendation to come out of the inquiry," Mr Fitzgerald said.

"In particular, clearly stating the operational role and responsibilities of each emergency service in preparation for a flood emergency, outlining the appropriate chain of command, communication protocols and engagement with the local community."

Mr Fitzgerald said Loddon Shire looks forward to the Victorian Government considering the recommendations and responding within the next six months.

"These changes will not only strengthen our community's resilience to future flood events but enhance our ability to recover more effectively." The 2022 flood event affected 63 local government areas, totalling 81% of all local

government areas across Victoria. The tabling of the Committee's Final Report follows extensive community engagement and public hearings during the past 18 months.

The final report concluded there needed to be a more integrated, community centred and accessible approach to emergency management, from planning through to recovery.

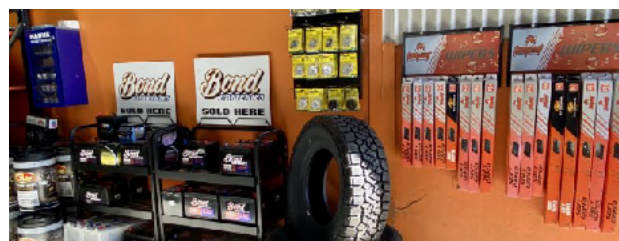
