Found at St Pat's School..

Who remembers these wonderful little recipe books?! Today I have chosen one recipe I think could be useful.. and the other that has me horrified.. Again, give me a call if you try these recipes and let me know how you go.

FLAKY PASTRY

- 8 oz flour
- 1/2 teaspoon of baking flour or cream of tartar
- 6 oz shortening [butter, lard or mixture of the two]
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1/2 cup water

Method: Sift flour and salt. Add shortening in pieces about the size of a walnut and chop through flour with a knife. Mix to a firm dough with lemon juice and water. Knead till smooth and roll into oblong strip. Sprinkle lightly with flour and fold in 3. Repeat rolling three times, then let pastry stand in a cool place 1/2 hour. Bake in hot oven.

KIDNEY SOUP

- 2 sheeps kidneys or 1/2 oz kidney
- 1/2 onion
- 1 dessertspoon fat
- 1 quart stock or water
- 1 tablespoon flour
- 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard.
- Salt and Pepper to taste

Method: Cut up onion and kidney, fry in very hot fat, stirring all the time until brown. Add flour and mustard and fry 5 mins more. Add half the stock and keep stirring until it boils. Simmer 1/2 hour, then add rest of stock and simmer further 1/2 hour. If not thick enough add a little blended cornflour.

Commencing Monday 7 October – Mail out of ballot packs

Start the new irrigation season on front foot

With the irrigation season just days away, farmers and other water users are being encouraged to prepare their irrigation infrastructure and familiarise themselves with their entitlements.

The 2024/25 irrigation season begins on 15 August, with water entitlement holders able to place orders as early as 10 August.

Goulburn-Murray Water (GMW) general manager Water Delivery Services Warren Blyth advised customers to review their water entitlements before ordering.

“It is important people understand their licences and the amount of water they are entitled to before the new irrigation seasons begins,” he said.

“Using more than your licence allows is illegal and means you can be prosecuted for water theft.

“We strongly encourage customers with any questions about their licences or entitlements to get in touch with us.”

Depending on whether a system is fully modernised or not, water orders require either 48 or 24 hours’ notice. However, irrigators are encouraged to place their orders earlier to help Water Systems Operators plan deliveries in advance.

Irrigators are also advised to ensure their on-farm irrigation infrastructure is in working condition to make sure they get water at the flow rate they order.

This includes inspecting pumps, pipelines and other infrastructure for any debris or blockages.

Customers can contact GMW with any maintenance issues relating to the broader water delivery network.

If a customer is looking to report a maintenance issue or has questions regarding their water licences or entitlements, they can phone GMW’s Water Systems Operations team on 1300 469 469.

Customers wanting to access WaterLINE – GMW’s water ordering system – can do so by downloading the waterline app or via waterline.g-mwater.com.au

The Resource Manager makes seasonal determinations for all northern Victorian regulated river systems. The Minister for Water appointed G-MW to undertake this role in accordance with Victorian water sharing rules.

Update of 2024/25 seasonal determinations

The Resource Manager for northern Victoria today announced an update of 2024/25 seasonal determinations.

The Murray system seasonal determination increases from 68 per cent of high-reliability water shares (HRWS) to 73 per cent HRWS. The Goulburn and Loddon systems increase from 73 per cent HRWS to 89 per cent.

The Campaspe system increases from 100 per cent HRWS to 100 per cent HRWS and 13 per cent of low-reliability water shares (LRWS). The Broken system increases from 8 per cent HRWS to 17 per cent HRWS. The Bullarook system remains unchanged at 0 per cent HRWS.

Resource Manager Mark Bailey said rain in recent weeks was the main contributor to the seasonal determination increases announced today.

“Rainfall in most of the catchment areas in the last fortnight has generated flows into major storages above our conservative estimates,” he said.

“It also means we can include flows expected to be captured in the storages in the coming weeks.

“The impact of these factors is that there is more water available for allocation.

“The Bullarook system needs more flows into the storages before there is enough water available for allocation. There are sufficient reserves available to deliver the allocation carried over from last year.”

The seasonal determinations for northern Victorian water systems on Thursday, 1 August are:

Trading Opportunities

Allocation trade from New South Wales to Victoria is limited to the lesser of a net annual volume of 200 GL or a volume that keeps the risk of spill in Victoria’s share of both Hume and Dartmouth reservoirs below 50 per cent. As the risk of spill from Victoria’s share of Hume and Dartmouth is currently greater than 50 per cent, allocation trade from New South Wales to Victoria is not possible. The volume available for trade is updated monthly with each risk of spill announcement.

Customers participating in the water trading market can monitor trade availability on the Water Register website: waterregister.vic.gov.au/water-trading/allocation-trading.

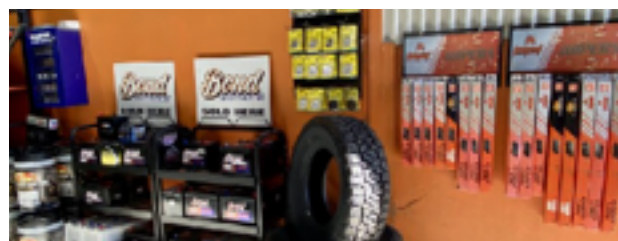

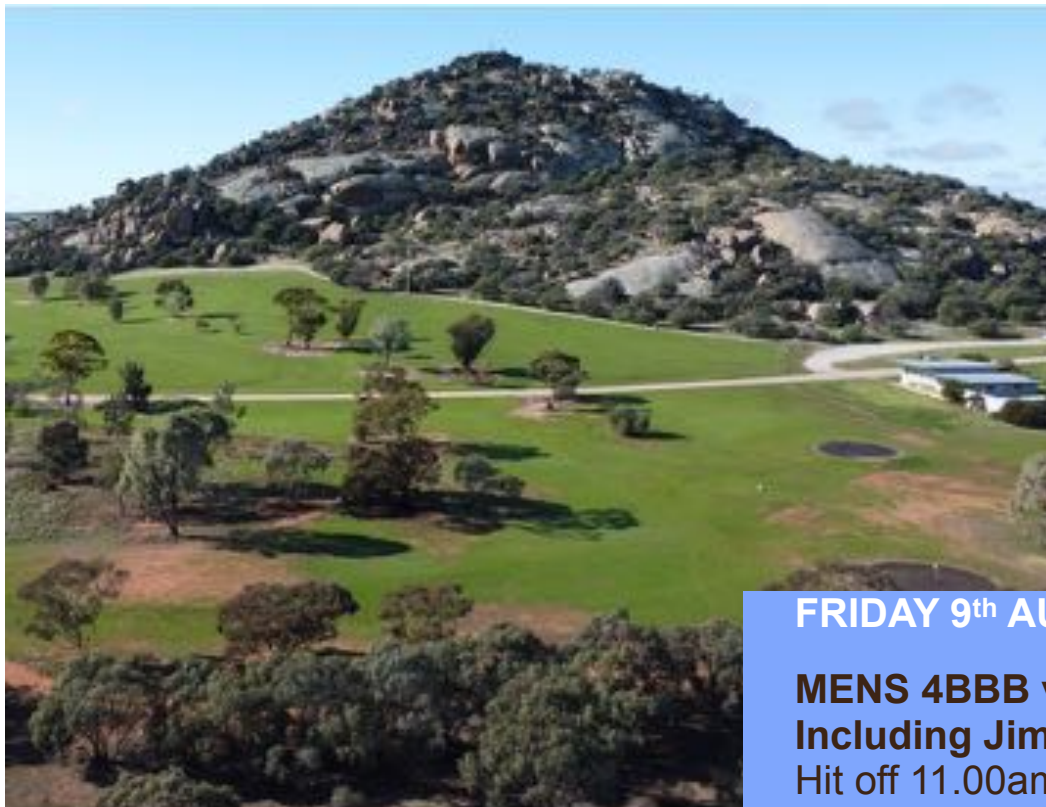
