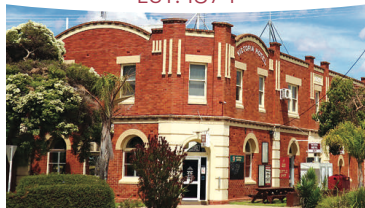

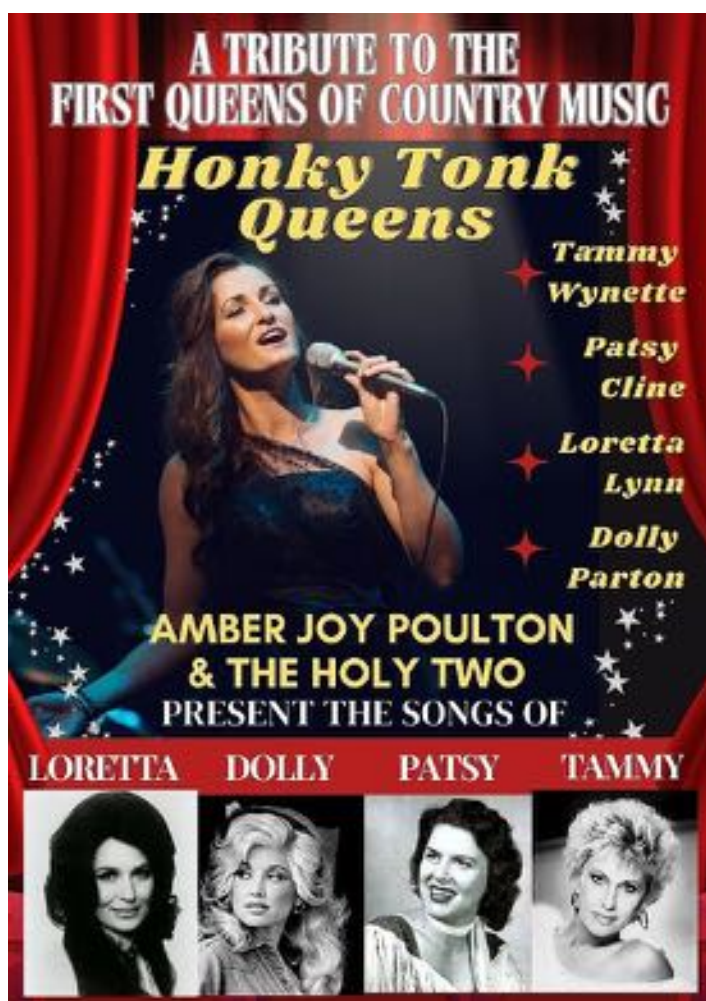

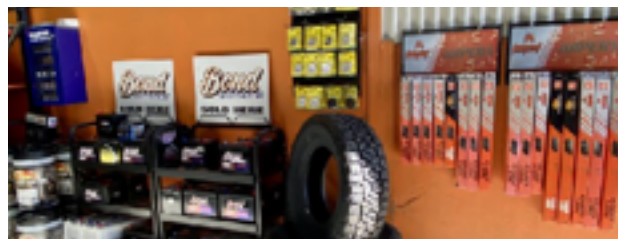

Football Notes

At last, the 2024 “Grand Finale” has arrived and the Bulldogs members, supporters and players will get to see the Reserves, Seniors and A-Grade Netballers battle for the main prize. It has been a long journey since that first pre-season get together, and often the players, events and activities that helped create the year-long memories are overlooked; here is a brief review of the year-that-was at the “Kennel”.

After a couple of years in recess the Under 18's, under the respected coaching and leadership of Bryden Morison and Luke Roberts, spent their second season back in the competition. After a solitary win in 2023 the boys were able to win 3 of their 14 home and away games, and went down narrowly in the Elimination final. Throughout the year, 6 of the squad were able to experience games in the Reserves, with 2 of that group, Blake Gibson and Harry Goodes also getting called up into the “Ones”. Harry also was selected in the Victorian SEDA Cup team that played in Perth in August. Harry went on to win the U 18's Club B+F, with Blake the Runner-Up. It was great to see so many family members supporting the boys and it certainly added to the community-feel at Thursday night training sessions. Thanks again to Bryden and Luke. The Reserves, again under the “fatherly eye” of Stephen “Stiffa” Donat, kept ‘Dogs fans guessing early in the season where back-to-back wins were hard to come by. Courtesy of injuries, player availability and weekend work commitments, it was at times difficult to assemble a weekly squad of 22. After 12 season victories and a double-chance secured, things had fallen into place, and courtesy of a gruelling, low-scoring clash in the 2nd semi final the boys are through to consecutive G.F. appearances.

From the squad that represented the Club in last season's final's series there were no fewer than 11 who had either retired or moved on. Our recruiters did a top job and we welcomed some very handy replacements; Kaleb Quinn, Nathan Coyle, Dylan Holden, Matt Smith, Dolf Reid and Sean O'Reilly all fitted seamlessly into the “Kennel”, with everyone agreeing they are all “top blokes”.

Again, the group were led in excellent fashion on-field by Matt Moon, and Tom Walker, after B+F wins in 2019, made it win number 3 after he backed up winning last year's Trophy. Entering Round 17 Mitch Dingwall was not in contention for a goal kicking trophy, but, “bang”, “bang”... 10 goals, followed by 15 in rounds 17 and 18 respectively, and a public “hand-stand”, saw him suddenly reach a half-century, and the Trophy was his; his second at League-level.

On the bench Coach Stephen has been assisted by magnet-mover Matt Scott, runners Chris Leerson, Troy Woolhouse and Sean O'Reilly (after an injury

interrupted season), and as a group they have worked their magic and hope that today they can be rewarded for their commitment.

The Senior Squad, again under the masterful and considered decision-making of coach Nathan Fitzpatrick, assisted on the bench by Brad Morison and a plethora of others, are hoping to go one step further than last year. 74 years is a long time between “drinks” and the town and district will be eagerly awaiting the result. From the squad that represented the Club in last year's finals series 5 have retired or moved on.
