

STRIDE is a FREE Primary Health Network funded program aimed at servicing regional isolated areas with psychosocial support to those experiencing mental health concerns.

The service will be at the Pyramid Hill Neighbourhood House between 2-4pm every second Wednesday from September 11th 2024.

One of our staff will be available to have a chat with at these times, or you may call Helena 0428805777 or Russell 0447281757 9-5 Monday to Friday, and we will do our best to take your call or get back at our earliest convenience.

The service aims to assist people aged 16 and older in their recovery goals and impacts of their mental illness for an intervention period of 3 – 6 months.

This may be in the forms of assisting to build routines, find meaningful activities, link with mental health services, help build social connections, assist with Service Victoria applications, assist NDIS evidencing and referral, assist with advocacy, assist with educational and employment goals, linking with financial counselling, linking Alcohol and Other Drug [AOD] services and assist with managing daily living needs.




Council has placed the draft Recreation, Open Space and Aquatic Strategy (ROSA) on display and invites interested community members or groups to provide their feedback.


FRUIT FLY ADVICE

Adult fruit flies survive winter by staying in warm spots. These are usually evergreen trees such as citrus, feijoa, olive, loquat, guava and avocado trees. Regional trapping this year indicates higher than normal numbers, which will require even greater vigilance.

When temperatures rise above 16C, they become active and look for food. Bait spraying is environmentally friendly and least disruptive to beneficial insects. Approximately 50ml is spot sprayed onto the tree trunks or foliage. There is no need to spray the whole tree.

A bait spray is usually yeast liquid as the attractant, mixed with a small amount of insecticide. There are organic options available. Ask your friendly hardware store for options.

Now is the time to prepare to minimise the damage of the QFF on this year's crop. Traps can be placed in your fruit trees and around your vegetables anytime from now on.

Diversion Cost Review underway

Goulburn-Murray Water's (GMW) Diversions Cost Review is now underway, with the customer reference group having held its first meeting on 28 August.

The group will provide its recommendations and advice through a series of workshops in the coming months.

At their first meeting, the group discussed their priorities for the review and what they hoped it would achieve.

The group also discussed how data on GMW's diversions services would be collected and was given a presentation on the history of the diversions tariffs and how they have evolved over time.

Reference group member Brian Reid said the first meeting had been a productive one.

"It was a very positive experience," he said.

"I learned a lot at the meeting. It's a good cross-section of diversions customers within the group, so I think it's a very encouraging start to the process."

The reference group includes all types of diversions customers, including large, medium and small customers from the regulated, unregulated and groundwater services.

GMW Diversions Groundwater and Streams manager Peter Clydesdale said he was pleased to have the review underway.

"It was good to be able to meet the group and hear their different thoughts on diversions services costs and where potential improvements can be made," he said.

"The discussions were very constructive and I'm confident the people in this group will serve as excellent representatives for the broader diversions customer base."

GMW will now begin new data collection methods to gain a greater insight into the diversions services' underlying costs.

The findings from this data will be reported back to the group in November.
