Pyramid Rats Remembered

The Pyramid Hill & District Historical Society invite members of the district to attend a special Remembrance Service in Pyramid Hill on November 11, followed by the launch of a new and unique exhibition in the RSL Hall.

The Descendants of the Rats of Tobruk Australia Association has identified seventeen WW11 servicemen who were born in or lived in Pyramid Hill and served with the 'Rats' in Tobruk. The Association has produced a special tribute for each soldier, which will be presented to the Pyramid Hill & District Historical Society for display in the RSL hall.

The formal presentation and unveiling of the portraits will take place following a Commemorative Service on Remembrance Day, November 11, at the RSL hall in McKay Street as follows:

- 10.00 : Morning tea at the RSL hall
- 10.45 : Remembrance Service; opportunity to lay wreaths
- 11.15 : Presentation of Portraits by Descendants of the Rats of Tobruk Association
