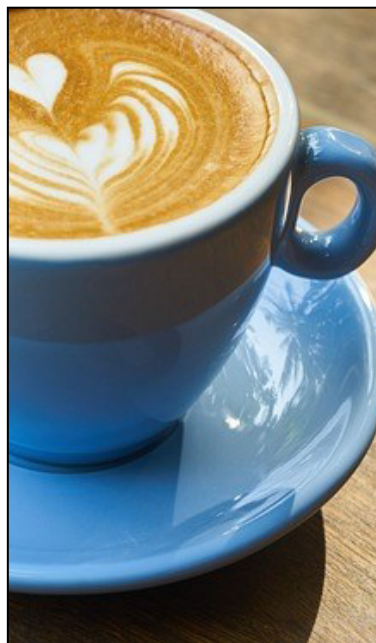

Wednesday Pennant:

They won seven of the last ten ends, whilst keeping their opponents to three single shot entries. The total 25 – 10 was a match winner and a Freddo Frog Award Winner.

Roma's rink, with Suzanne, Kate and Heather, pegged neck and neck for the majority of the match until.... guess which end!!!!?? Yes, it was the 18th end when they suddenly came unstuck and squandered their lead by giving away ten shots on the trot. Things were looking very dire for Tony C., Marie N., Joe and Ian. They barely troubled the scoreboard and were 4 – 18 shots down at the thirteenth end. Then it was the Cohuna Golf folk who suffered the "curse of the eighteen". Their score stagnated on 18 while the Pyramid team gallantly won eight of the last ten ends to get within four shots.

In fact, had it not been for a good bowl by the opposition Skip for his last bowl of the day, the margin would have been even fewer. The tally of 15-19 was a great fight back, and enough to ensure the overall win by four shots. A great team effort.

Division 2: welcomed the Cohuna side. Tony B's team of George, Anthony and Carmen were first to settle and cruised to a comfortable lead losing on only three ends up until the fourteenth.

A lapse of concentration maybe, or a determined effort by Cohuna to make inroads saw them win the next five ends to put themselves into contention and only three shots down. Tony and his troops rallied and put the game beyond doubt by winning the last three ends to record a healthy eight shot victory, 23-15.

piece by losing two sets of four to be behind 5-10 on the sixth end, before they were able to gain a little ground. An enthralling game was developing overall when tallying the scores from both rinks. Little separated them all match.

Reclaiming back the five and then claiming a couple of threes, brought them a little hope. They managed to get within nine shots of Wakool, before their opposition sailed off into the sunset with ease leaving them in their wake, wounded and battered losing 17-33. It was not the desired finish when the other two rinks were so close. The 52- 71 final score can be used as an incentive for improvement.

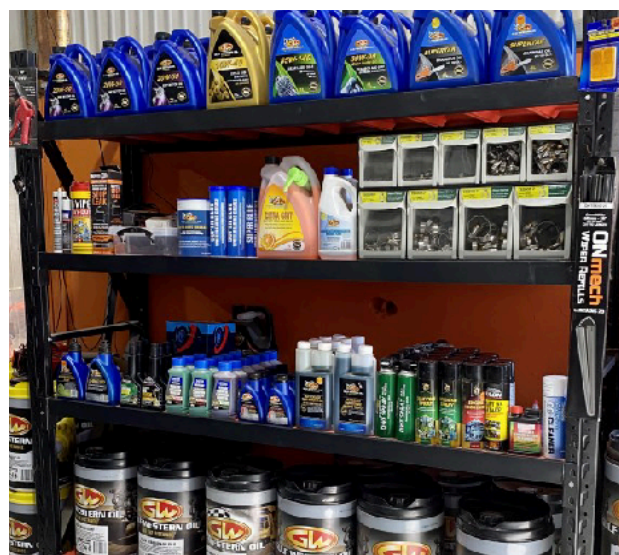
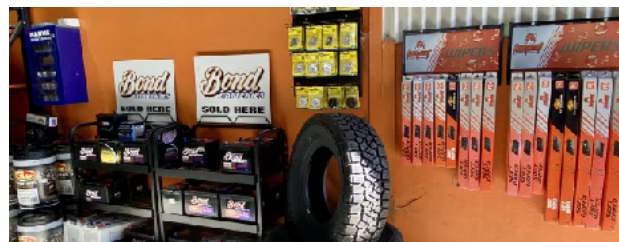

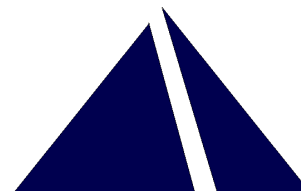
