Bowls Notes

Mother Nature, or the BOM, or whoever is in charge of the weather elements, must have finally got the message that lawn bowls is more enjoyable played under pleasant weather conditions, as that was what was provided this week. Thank the heavens! Well, for Wednesday, at least. Saturday ...that's another story!

Wednesday Pennant:

Division 1 hosted the very strong Cohuna 1 side as we began the second round of matches for the Season. Our previous encounter against Cohuna 1 was the very first match and, as we recalled, there was a gaping hole between the scores when Cohuna won that bout 85-31 shots with two of our rinks not managing to make double figures. In consideration of those figures, the encouraging fact is that we have made improvements. Now, don't get excited! We still didn't register a win anywhere, but our loss was not so dramatic. Roma, along with Suzanne, Kate and Heather maintained their prowess and again lost by just the one shot. This time their score was 18-19, in comparison to the last effort 17-18. That's consistency for you! Not only that, they won the Freddo Frog Award in the first round and won it again this week. A double dose of consistency!

Marie S. with Jan, Loraine and Rose scored 16-29 losing by thirteen shots which was a resounding improvement of the first round when they suffered a humiliating twenty-five shot loss. Admittedly, there was a change of players and a change to the opposition line up, but the result was encouraging. On the third rink, Skippered by Tony C. with Marie N., Joe and Ian, the outcome was also soul-elevating as they lost by eleven shots, 16-27, in comparison to the first defeat by twenty-eight shots. The overall tally 50 -75 definitely reads better than 31-85. Well done, crew! That's the good stuff we are made of. We can't all be bowlers like Kelsey Cottrell or Aaron Wilson or we would be representing Australia in the Olympic Games, but on our own bit of turf, that is a fine effort. (In actual fact, lawn bowls has not yet reached the status of being part of the Olympic programme, although it is part of the Paralympic programme for the last seven years – just a bit of trivia, in case anyone feels they may have been over-looked for selection.)

Division 2 visited Gunbower to tackle our neighbours, some of whom had been playing with us for a couple of years when Gunbower had insufficient numbers to field their own team. Now, with the rule inclusion of unlimited men and no position differentials, it has enabled the Club to have more flexibility, and it soon became evident where these people's hearts were. Tony B. and his team of George, Maurie and Carmen began the game well and kept up the pace until the midway mark. Then the score started to gradually gravitate Gunbower's way and ended up out of reach with our neighbours winning 21-9. Sadly, there were no good news stories this week as the rink

Skippered by Allan, with Anthony, Dorothy and Robyn was total forgettable from start to finish. Gunbower took complete control leaving our folk utterly powerless 6-43. Another day to put behind us. Next week's matches for Midweek Pennant: November 27th , Division 1 travel to Barham while Division 2 host Cohuna Golf 2.

Saturday Pennant:

Now apparently the powers in charge of the weather have had enough of our whining about the wind, and retaliated with a vengeance! With the prediction of hot, hot weather, the Saturday matches were fast tracked to the morning in an attempt to avoid the worst of the heat.

That seemed to be a providential move for Division 2 who faced up to the top placed Cohuna Golf side and managed to pull off an overall victory, 79-59. That twenty shot win was secured by two rinks who enjoyed the conditions and held steady throughout their games. Well, fairly steady. Lionel's rink saw a change of personnel with the inclusion of Ray P. playing third, Marie N. and David. They were coasting along very nicely with their opponents stalemating on two shots for twelve ends.

That jolly lunch break saw them lose momentum and they gave away a run of twelve shots in the period of four ends straight after the break. With their opponents then just four shots in arrears, they managed to regroup and bring home the bacon with a final flurry of their own, winning another twelve shots over the last five ends to finish 31-14 ahead. (Twelve seemed to be the operative number!) Terry D. continued his fine form as Skip and led the way for Jan, Ian and Rose as they all steadily plied their skills, gelling together magnanimously to create a winning total 31-13. Once they got their noses in front at the sixth end, they never let up on the pressure, stamping their dominance with a haul of fourteen shots in five ends. They were the Freddo Frog winners, too!

A big pat on the back to them. Nathan, in his new position as Skip, had a close encounter all day and had worked hard to build up a promising lead until the eighteenth end, when an errant drive sent the bowls scattering and gifted the opposition with a soul breaking five shots. Giving away nine shots on the last four ends left his team with Jean, Kate and Terry S., floundering 17-22 at the final siren. That was a disappointing finish to what was otherwise a very fine performance. Regardless, the win on two rinks and an overall win, has bolstered our confidence and premiership points.

Division 3 did not fare so well with the change to the morning time slot against the might of Kerang Golf who strolled in the gate in dribs and drabs, like Brown's cows, without a care in the world.

Maybe this was just a façade as it didn't take them long to settle down to business once on the greens. The first to feel their might was Joe and his team of Anthony, Jasmine and Allan. Their opposition very smartly amassed twelve early shots to zip, before the home side kicked into gear

and managed scoring seven before Kerang Golf put the foot down again. Not going away, our guys fought back to be within four shots with two ends to play, but had out of good luck charms. The victory went to Kerang Golf 17-24 despite PH winning eleven of the twenty-one ends. That's a moral victory, of sorts. The rink Skippered by Lorraine, with Maurie, Carmen and Tony R., opened their account on the first end but other scoring opportunities were few and far between and they only added singles when the occasion did occur. The loss of a four, then later in the game two threes, put the game beyond doubt with the score line stretched out to a fourteen shot deficit, 9-23.

The last rink of Tony B. and his team of George, Amy and Robyn were last to suffer the pain, and pain it was.

After claiming first blood at the start, they saw Kerang Golf claim two fours, followed by two threes in quick succession and the game slipped away at a rapid rate. Keeping the pressure on the rest of the game, the opposition really rubbed it in with a haul of eleven shots on the final two ends to amass a whopping 37-9 total. To our credit, we are fielding Pennant sides each week, but are not of the same calibre as other Clubs with players chosen on performance. However, It is great to see our new and older bowlers face up week after week - one day things will improve, we hope.

Next Week's matches: Saturday 30th November, Division 2 travel to Barham – hopefully the Midweek comp will have afforded some valuable practice on the carpeted surface. Division 3 are rostered to host Cohuna 3 at home. Here's hoping for some more success.






The four advent themes this year are hope, peace, joy and love, and each week during our services we light a candle for each of these themes leading up to Christmas

We all need hope. Hope gets us through the difficult times. Hope gives us a promise of things to come. That there is a plan and purpose to all that goes on around us. In Advent we celebrate the hope of Christ coming into our world.

In the coming of Christ, we experience a God who did not write us off as a bad idea or a bad debt. In fact, we celebrate that God came to serve us, to be with us, to bring about a plan that would one day bring about a saving plan.

The birth of Christ always amazes me every year we celebrate it. The God who created the universe, who made it all come into being was willing to come and be with me and you and the whole world. That says that we are worthwhile, that God sees something in us worth going through all this for.

That gives me hope. It also gives me hope to realise that God has a plan and God will bring about a plan to restore all things.

If you are struggling with feelings of hopelessness this year may you experience the hope that Christ brings to every person this year.


