

Keep an eye out for expressions of interest in early next year.

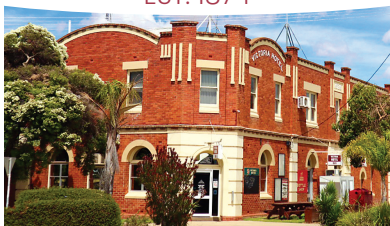

TIPS FOR NAVIGATING THE FESTIVE SEASON

The festive season is a time for family togetherness, celebration and fun. But for families with neurodiverse children, it can be a daunting time. Neurodiverse children may become overwhelmed by the extra socialising, changes in routine, bright lights and noise.

Try the following tips to help make this festive season enjoyable for all.

Use visuals. Have a list or calendar on the fridge so your child can see what is happening each day. Create a social story so your child knows what is expected of them.

Practice greetings, and answers to questions, your child is likely to face from family.

Create a quiet space where your child can take a break from noise and people. If you are celebrating at the home of family or friends, talk to them about where your child can go for a break.

Plan shorter catch-ups with family and friends to reduce the chance your child will become dysregulated.

Suggest alternative forms of greetings such as hand-shake, fist bump or wave, for children that are not comfortable with physical touch.

Take care of yourself. Keep expectations reasonable. There is no right way to celebrate. Do whatever works for your family.

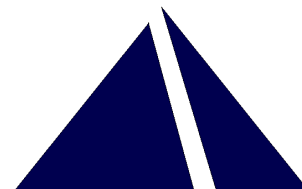

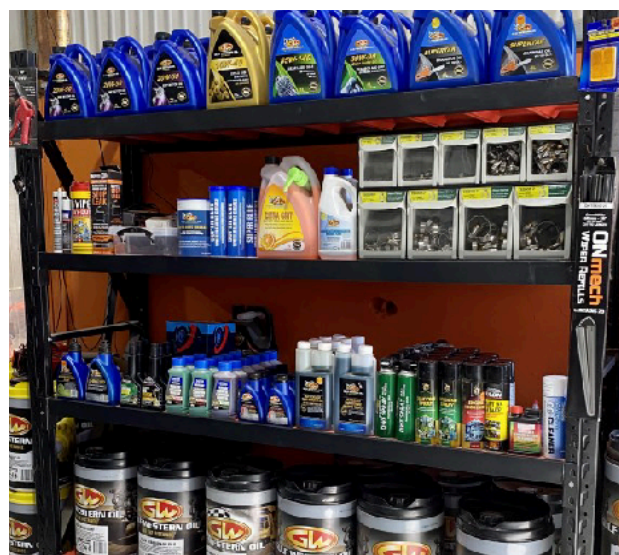
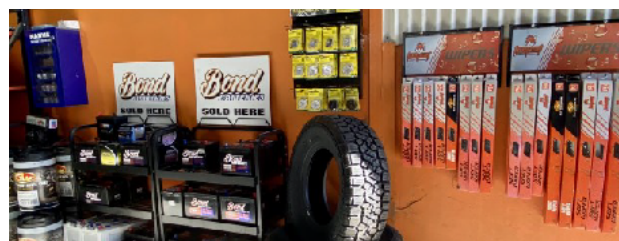
