HARD RUBBISH COLLECTION

The kerbside hard waste collection for 2025 will commence on Monday 3 March to coincide with Clean Up Australia Day on the first Sunday in March. Items may be placed on the nature strip on Sunday 2 March (not before or after).

Eligible properties

Properties with a mandatory kerbside waste bin and recycling bin collection service located within the following zones Township Zone, Low Density Residential Zone and Rural Living Zones as defined within the Loddon Planning Scheme are eligible. Outside of these zones, the kerbside bin collection service is optional and a kerbside hard waste collection is not provided.

Residents are reminded:

- the service is limited to the collection of metal, e-waste, furniture and white goods
- to sort items for collection into piles, i.e. metal items, e-waste, furniture and white goods.
- total volume is not to exceed one cubic meter per household
- excessive or unsorted piles will not be collected
- no other items will be collected
- any unsuitable items will be left behind
- it is the responsibility of the householder to remove unsuitable items from the nature strip immediately
- infringement notices may be issued if uncollected items are left on the nature strip.

Items that will not be collected include:

- general waste
- green waste
- tyres
- oils
- batteries
- paints
- chemicals
- car parts
- mattresses
- solar panels.

Alternative option to hard waste

Council continues to provide residents waste disposal vouchers. This allows residents to dispose of up to 4 cubic metres per voucher of general domestic waste free of charge at any of our landfill and transfer stations.

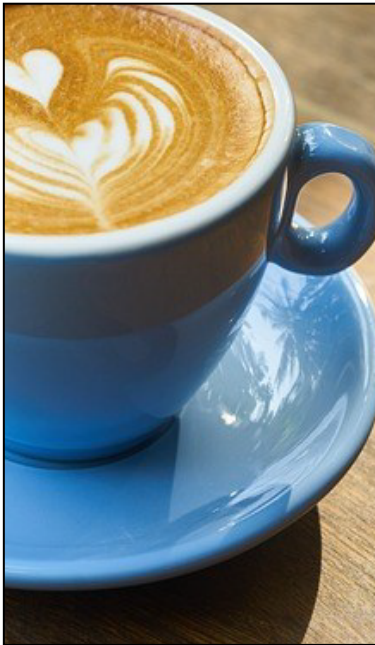

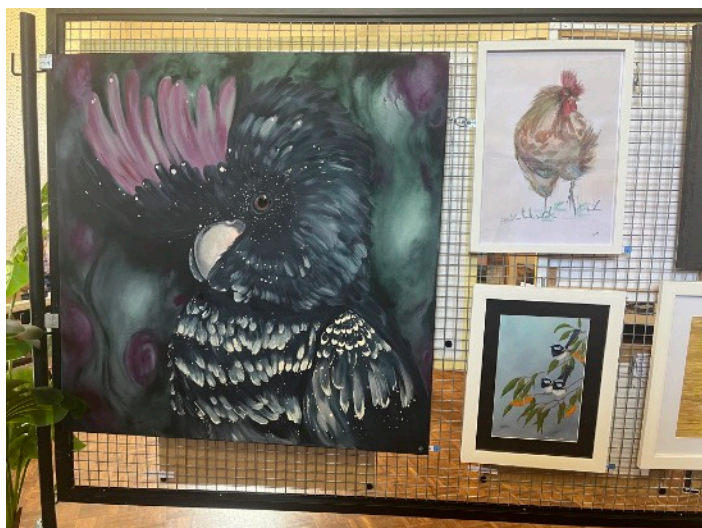

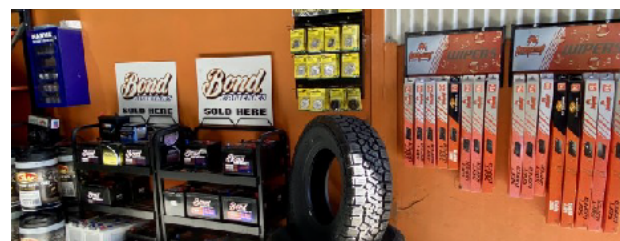

Dry weather brings restrictions into play

As the dry weather continues, Goulburn-Murray Water (GMW) is encouraging its diversions customers who are on unregulated waterways to stay up to date with the latest restrictions on how much water they can take.

Unregulated waterways are creeks, rivers and streams that rely on natural stream flows rather than releases from GMW-managed storages.

Within the Goulburn and Murray River Basins managed by GMW, there are more than 3000 GMW customers who take water from these waterways.

The flows in these unregulated streams, creeks and rivers are closely monitored by GMW. If they drop to a defined trigger levels, restrictions are implemented to meet essential domestic and stock needs and maintain the health of the waterway.

GMW Diversions Groundwater and Streams Manager Peter Clydesdale said recent conditions meant several of these waterways were now either on or facing restrictions.

“With the recent dry weather, we are seeing reduced flows in many of the streams, creeks and rivers in our region,” he said.

“There are restrictions in place for several waterways in our region, and in the coming weeks it is likely restrictions will be introduced for several more.”

There are five stages of restrictions GMW applies to its streams, creeks and rivers. The first four limit people to taking a certain percentage of their water entitlement every 10 days, the fifth only allows people to take water for domestic and stock purposes.

Mr Clydesdale said it was important that diverters remain aware of any potential changes to restrictions.

“Historically, it is quite common for there to be restrictions during this time of year,” he said.

“However, before 2024, we had a few consecutive wet years, which means some customers are facing restrictions for the first time in years.

“It is therefore a good time for customers to familiarise themselves with the rules that are in place around restrictions, and get in touch with us if they have any questions.”

Customers are notified if restrictions are implemented in their area.
