Farewell to a great sportsman and friend Trout Harrison

The Pyramid Hill Football Netball Club is deeply saddened by the passing of Phillip "Trout" Harrison - a true legend of country footy and a man held in the highest regard across many clubs and communities.

Though Trout's time at Pyramid Hill is just one chapter in a remarkable football journey, it was one that showcased the very best of what he brought to the game, unmatched talent, grit, and heart. His on-field achievements while at Pyramid Hill were nothing short of extraordinary. Trout won three club Best & Fairest awards, was runner-up in the League Best & Fairest, then went on to claim three consecutive NDFL Barr Medals. Remarkably, he followed that up by winning the prestigious Morrison Medal in the GVFL the very next year.

Trout was as tough as nails; the kind of player who gave everything, every single time he pulled on a jumper. He was one of the toughest and most determined footballers many ever had the privilege of playing with or against. And off the field, he was a loyal mate, always great company, and a valuable contributor to the game as a coach and later as an umpire.

As an enduring gift of having Trout involved in our club, we were also blessed to have Trout's family play much of their early days at Pyramid



Hill. The Harrison family brought so much to PHFNC, and their connection is one we deeply cherish.

We extend our sincerest sympathies to Lynne, Aaron, Abbey, Ebony, Britt and the extended Harrison family.

During Education Week, primary students actively participated and learnt through different math games. These games made math fun and memorable for everyone.



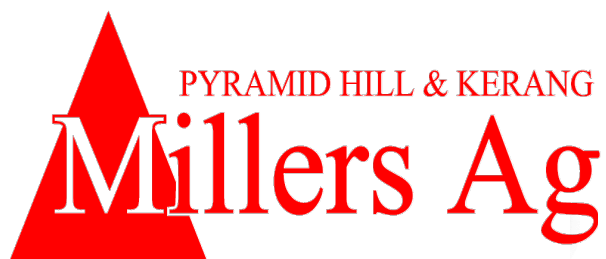
NCD and Sandhurst Cross Country
