

First Meeting for our future Hostel!

The first planning meeting for the future of our hostel was held on Wednesday 4th June, and attracted around 60 of our community.

Drew Chislett opened the meeting with saying that what we have is a new future for the Hostel building, and together we could plan what we want with what we have got.

The Deed of Gift from Respect Aged Care includes 2 titles and the land on which our Hostel stands.

The meeting was a preliminary to putting together a community ownership model - that would safeguard our asset into the future. There have been discussions with lawyers around building a Trust, with Trustees from Pyramid Hill as well as some external experienced people to ensure we have a skilled and representative model. This will need a few more weeks to form.

Drew ensured the meeting remained positive and hopeful, and together we were asked what we wanted, what the questions are that we need to ask going forward, and what happens next.

We also saw a video [expertly] taken by Drew that shows the condition of the inside of the Hostel, Hospital and Kitchen. All in good to fair condition. Some work will be required and a financial investment to get it up and working again.

Drew also thanked the ongoing support of Ian Bartels in maintaining the Hostel, so it is in as good condition as it can be after years of vacancy, Trevor Mac for keeping an eye on the place - and poignantly for the work of Ray Leed, who was a passionate advocate for the return of the Hostel.

At the end of the meeting, community members were asked to indicate their willingness to join a working party for the next steps - be that administrative - or even helping with maintenance, clean up and gardening.

An email address has been set up for those wanting to keep in close contact with the next stages.

TITLE: Opposition to levy takes the next step

Loddon Shire Council has been at the forefront of opposition to the Victorian Government's Emergency Services Volunteer Fund Levy and that opposition took the next step this week.

Councillors at the May monthly meeting on Tuesday, 27 May, moved a four part motion as follows:

That Council

1. Reiterates our objections from the 25th of March to the proposed introduction of the abhorrent Emergency Services Volunteer Fund Levy in its current form, due to the significant, unfair and inequitable impacts it will have on the Shire's farming, commercial and industrial sectors.
2. Call on the State Government to listen to our community and immediately repeal the implementation of the Emergency Services Volunteer Fund Levy (Bill).
3. As the Bill is awaiting Royal Assent, we call on Professor the Honourable Margaret Gardner AC Governor of Victoria to exercise her reserve powers and not sign this bill (ESVFL) into Law.
4. Authorise the Mayor to write to all Victorian Councils, Rural Councils Victoria and the Municipal Association of Victoria seeking them to unite and as a collective oppose the collection of the Emergency Services Volunteer Fund Levy.

Loddon Shire Mayor Dan Straub said the motion was the obvious next step after Councillors attended a rally against the levy in Melbourne last week.

"That rally was attended by 10,000 people including many residents from Loddon Shire," Cr Straub said.

"Those residents are not only landowners who will have to pay this unjust and unfair levy but also emergency services volunteers themselves.


"For them to leave their farms at this busy time of year at short notice to make their voices heard shows the level of concern in our communities, and that level is unprecedented.

"Council has actively been lobbying against this levy since we were made aware of it, and we will continue to do so."

Despite temperatures dipping to just **2 degrees**, the runners at Event #9 of the Pyramid Hill Golf Trail parkrun delivered sizzling performances.


