

Pyramid Hill Park Run

Guest run report by Robin Rishworth, A1573155 (from the Yarra Valley).

Having seen all 121 of Victoria's current and former public parkruns. I am in a good position to comment on this event. The course circumnavigates Pyramid Hill Peak three times on a mostly gravel trail with few flat sections. From large sections of the trail the course offers views off to the plains out to the horizon while looking to the peak spectacular views of large granite boulders make up the view.

The trail appears to be either climbing on gentle grades or descending. The total gain is around 115 vertical metres making it one of Victoria's toughest trails. The gravel trail has many gentle uphill grades and is often wide while there are several sections where the track becomes narrow as it weaves between large granite boulders. In a few places there is a choice of two routes to choose from either a narrow section between boulders or go wider. This is not common in any of Victoria's other parkruns.

I think the course is one of the most scenic of all Victoria parkruns. The temperature was 7 degrees C, much warmer than the previous week. But the temperature did not feel comfortable with lots of moisture in the air and a steady 20-25km north westerly wind hitting the participants on the northern part of the course. A few drops of rain just as the event started as well.

Twenty four people completed the course, more than double the previous week. The age ranged from Jan Walker in her 70s to Owlette Owlette who is 16.

People travelled from various parts of Victoria including a contingent from Bendigo.

The first finisher was Shane Theile who narrowly beat Mark Henderson previous mark by five seconds and recorded a time of 19.27. This is Shanes 29th time he has set an Australian parkrun course record. Before this event he only had one course record at Cohuna still standing.

Rhianna Wik Gamble started slowly and ran each lap faster to finish in second position, first female and break the course record and her previous best time by 20 seconds.

A total of seven age records were broken along with new age records set by Shane, Rhianna. Robin Rishworth, Rob Allwood, Trinity Sanderson, Cheryl Smit, Sue Gittins all broke age records.

Well done to volunteers: Rachel Cain, Jason Deller, Jean Mann, Lionel Mann, Carol Mullins, Thomas Smith, Kellie Stewart who all have volunteered many time more than they have participated and some these people have never participated just volunteered, well done.

There were two milestones this week with mother and daughter Owl Owl and Owlette Owlette completing their 25th parkrun. Owlette Owlette looked the part in her purple outfit including tutu and wings. While Renelle Mcmanus got the most aesthetically pleasing time for the day of 42.42. This week 24 people ran, jogged and walked the course, of whom 14 were first timers and 5 recorded new Personal Bests. Representatives of 5 different clubs took part.

For a small rural council Loddon Shire Council punches well above its weight in terms of the building and planning services it offers to residents, and that's been confirmed by recent data.

The latest Statutory Planning Permit Activity Report shows that in the first three months of 2025 every single Planning Permit application was processed within the 60-day time frame required by the Planning and Environment Act, well above the statewide rural average of 69.7 per cent.

But those applications didn't just sneak inside the limit – the average time taken was 40.8 days.

The median number of days was just 27, less than half the rural average of 58 days.

Of course some applicants might have noticed it took longer than any of those figures for them to be notified of the outcome.

If further information is requested, the clock stops until the application returns to Council.

Loddon Shire Mayor Dan Straub praised the efforts of Council staff in ensuring local applicants knew the result of their applications in a timely manner.

"It's a credit to the team to process such a high level of applications and they always set a high benchmark," Cr Straub said.

The latest Building Services Activity Report shows that 133 building permits were issued in the year to 31 March 2025, with a combined value of more than \$27 million.

A total of 120 Certificates of Final Inspection and 41 Occupancy Permits were also granted during the period.

Strategic Planning is another important part of Council's operations and there has also been plenty of work going on there during the early part of 2025.

The Strategic Planning Quarterly Activity Report shows work is progressing on several fronts, including amendments to the Loddon Planning Scheme, the Flood Planning Scheme Amendment, the Wedderburn Flood Study and Structure Plans for the five priority growth towns (Boort, Bridgewater, Inglewood, Pyramid Hill and Wedderburn).

"Strategic Planning is the grunt work behind every development that comes to fruition," Cr Straub said.

"We are in the early stages of many of these plans but it's important we get them right to ensure Loddon Shire prospers well into the future."

"All of these projects will also involve extensive community consultation so everyone will have their chance to have their say on the way forward."
