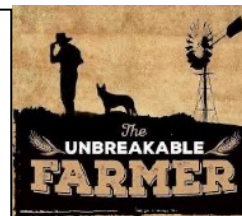

New Era for Hostel Building begins..

After careful and positive negotiations with Respect Aged Care, Pyramid Hill Progress Association are the current owners of the building that was the former Pyramid Hill Hostel.

The keys for the building were exchanged on 12 August, and the handover was seamless, with little fanfare, but the implications for our town are monumental.

The Progress Executive Team have worked hard on ensuring that this important building has been restored to the community. They also were very positive about all their dealing with Respect Aged Care, and how it was their joint goal that the community take the building to it's next purpose.

The working party that has been created to steer the future of the Hostel building will meet early next week, to discuss immediate next steps - including opening the doors for a community celebration - and scheduling a working bee!

Since taking ownership, the Progress team has already started work. Lighting has been upgraded throughout the facility and the hot water system is being maintained, and is becoming functional again.

Special mention to Drew Chislett, Penny Caspani, Trevor McIntosh, Nev and Michelle for supporting this first hurdle - and getting us to this point - and also being able to negotiate a stamp duty exemption on the deal!

Watch this space for a call to vacuum! Sweep cobwebs and machete the garden!

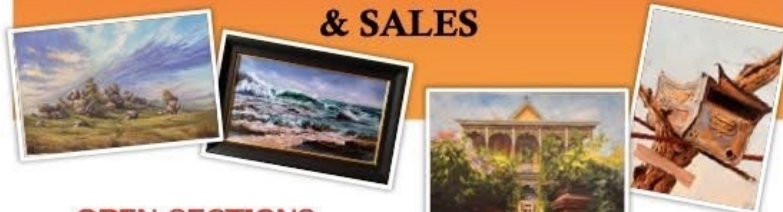

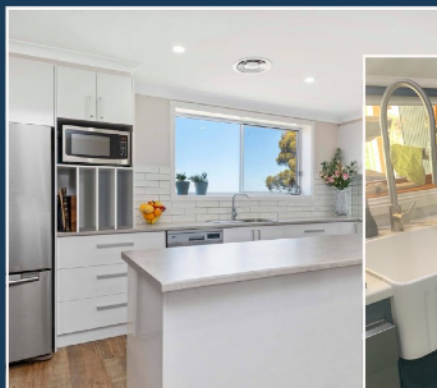

Regulator replacement - GMW Media Release

Replacement of the Western Waranga Channel Offtake near Fernihurst is helping highlight Goulburn-Murray Water's efforts to significantly reduce maintenance costs.

GMW Asset Reliability Manager Michael Hehir said the 92-year-old structure needed to be replaced due to its age and the deterioration of its concrete structure.

During the recent irrigation off-season, works to replace the regulator took place including replacing its five flume gates with a new gate system. The regulator now has two flume gates and two undershot slip gates – a first for GMW. Mr Hehir said the combination was expected to provide a significant cost saving. "Over the 30 year life cycle of the four mechanical gates it's anticipated we'll save 25 per cent on maintenance cost," he said.

Mr Hehir said there were several other benefits to the new structure including reduced wear and tear, being able to drain channels better to manage weeds, improving channel flow profile and reducing bank erosion.

He said any one of GMW's 727 sites that have more than one flume gate may fit the criteria to have an undershot gate installed if its concrete structure needed to be rebuilt. GMW Manager Asset Strategy and Engineering Support Shayne Lowe said the business was always looking at innovative ways to reduce costs and drive operational efficiency.

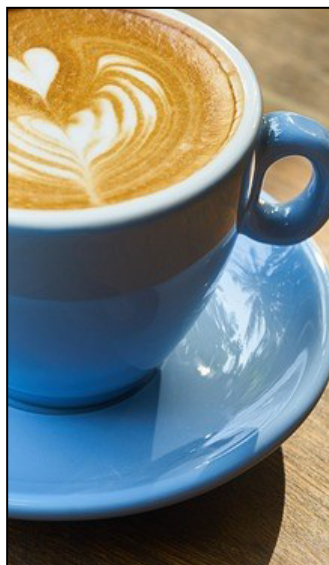
