





Bowls Notes

Here we are already back into the Pennant Season albeit with quite a different look.



Mid-Week Pennant

Firstly we must acknowledge that the first round of Midweek Pennant was a tough encounter before we even took to the greens. All players were feeling less than buoyant and a tad fragile as it really hit home that Lorraine was no longer with us. The Cohuna and Kerang teams respectfully joined us with a moment's silent reflection before we actually started play. Lorraine's absence was prominently noticeable and those "around the world bowls" with the very wide bias were not rolling in their own time to the beat of the drum. We all did our best to honour Lorraine with our determination and endeavor.

With two sides playing in Division 2 it was also a different look to what has been the case in the past when we have had a Division 1 and a Division 2. It was really nice to have both teams playing at home for our first matches. For the sake of convenience, one team will be identified as the Red team and the other team will be named the Blue team.

The Red Team composed of Marie N. (Skip), Carmen, Ian and Bill had a tightly contested affair all day. They started a little tardily but worked solidly to maintain a steady mantle, although they stumbled at the thirteenth end when they let their opponents jump onto an even footing by giving away five shots, which levelled things up at 12 all. Cohuna edged in front for the next few ends but we managed to restrict them to single shots each time. The 19th and 20th ends saw good numbers for us as we steadied and came home with a flurry. The final score 19-16 was a three shot well-earned win and entitled us to take the first, but co-recipients, of the Freddo Frog incentive award. Jan (Skip) along with Rose, Glen and Maurie were right in their match going pretty well neck and neck until they dropped seven shots on one end. As this horrible turn of events occurred late in the game, the margin became too great to make up in the few remaining ends. They finished up going down by 11 shots which was unfortunate as they had worked hard to get the better of their Cohuna opponents.

As a result, we lost our first hit out of the season by 8 shots (32-40) which, given the caliber of our opponents, was no disgrace.

The Blue team came away grinning broadly as they defeated the Kerang side by 1 shot. I shot is all it takes to broaden the smiles. Joe's team had started well and had their noses in front most of the match until a bit of a glitch just after the tea break, which

It was a couple of fine bowls on the last end that helped them over the line. Allan playing third, and Joe playing Skip, put in a couple of pearlys to break the hearts of the Kerang folk.

Working nicely into the head built by Anthony (Lead) and Lisa (substitute player), they maneuvered the kitty and surrounding bowls into just the right position to turn the tied score on the 21st end into a three shot win for the Hill and entitling them to share the Freddo Frog Award. Crickey, they were great shots! Their 20 - 17 victory enabled the whole side to cross the line as winners, due to the fact that Tony's team, who had been struggling initially, forged their way to an "almost win." They fell short by just two shots, ending 16-18 down, coming home with great gusto and accumulating 5 shots on their final end. George and Jasmine were bolstered by the inclusion of Substitute player, Garry, who was keen to offer some coaching advice along the way. That was a very stunning win against the Kerang crew who would probably have favoured themselves as winners.

Fantastic work, Blue Team. One can only imagine the squeals of joy and the delighted beam that would have etched Lorraine's face with that result.

Saturday Pennant

It was a days of testing, gusty winds and a day of mixed blessings. Division 2 travelled to Cohuna and, although the opposition looked formidable on paper, we proved to be more determined and more accurate across the rinks with all glory coming to Pyramid Hill. Allan as Skip, with Bill Ray and Michael gave our new comer a taste of what it's like to lose in bowls.

Despite the loss, Michael claimed that he enjoyed playing. Their score against tough opposition was 10 – 39 – it's always a bonus to make double figures. Tony playing Skip, with Dorothy having her first go at Third, along with Maurie and George had a slightly closer encounter only going down by 25 shots. The best performers on the day for Division 3 was the rink with Greg as Skip, Mari, Anthony and Jasmine.

Their final score was 11 – 24 shots down but it can be considered a fine effort against the strong Kerang side.


