



## ● Debutante Ball: A Night to Remember

## Bowls Notes:

### Mid-Week Pennant



It was a lean day on the greens for the Mid-week

Pennant players with not a win in sight at all. The **Red Team** travelled all the way to Wakool coming up with little in their pockets for their efforts. Jan's team of Joe, Kate and Rose took the accolades for the day being the best performers out of a very sorry lot. They played a team of men and kept well within range to finish just three shots short despite sharing the tally of ends won and lost. Their total of 15-18 earned them the Freddo Frog Award – not winners but best losers. The team with Marie N., Carmen, Ian and Joe had a much less flamboyant day. A bit of jibing that the ladies were producing more muscle power than the guys on the slow greens, somewhat purred the gents into action. Although holding their own until the snack break, they really lost momentum and found it hard to get motoring again. The final score, 23-14 looked less complimentary than it should have as they managed to win almost half the ends, however, they were unable to accumulate large numbers. On the upside, they didn't donate anything larger than a couple of fours themselves. The 41 -29 win to Wakool made the trip home seem longer than the early morning trip to the venue.

The **Blue Team** also travelled interstate, but only as far as Barham. Tony and his crew consisting of Dorothy, George and Glen allowed the Barham folk to get away to an enthusiastic twelve shots on the first three ends before troubling the scoreboard themselves. Mid-match it seemed they had finally accustomed to the synthetic greens, but the gifting of large numbers gave them little to no hope of bridging any gap. They finished 12-33 down but, in our terms any score in the double figures is worth noting. Beggars just can't be choosey when we are against the giants. Allan taking the role of Skip to Robyn, Anthony and Maurie equipped themselves more capably and, with the extraction of two ends tallying ten shots, it would have been a close encounter. The 14-26 total would have looked much more respectable. Barham would be pleased with their 26-59 win, but our folk did well to achieve what they did. It was a prolonged match due to the slick synthetic surface and resulted in a search for a late lunch.

### Saturday Pennant

The hosting of both Divisions 2 and 3 at home saw our greens covered with bowlers including those who travelled from Barham and those who travelled from Kerang Golf. It really is a joy to see the swarm of bowlers and hear the banter that goes on between them. A quick rearrangement of team compositions had to be negotiated, due to a necessary withdrawal and, with no emergency or substitute player available, Division 3 had to start their match a player short.

It seemed the **Division 2** players from Barham took a while to adjust to the grass surface. Jan's team of Jean, Kate and Rose got off to a dream start accumulating 9 shots to nil on the first seven ends before disaster struck and they let their opposition right back into the game by dropping 5 shots in one hit. From then on it was "game on" as the Barham folk took control of the next eight ends and drew away to be get nine shots in front. The final two ends saw our ladies reclaim some honour and reduce the final score to just a three shot deficit, 18 – 21. That was a great comeback! Marie S., Marie N. Joe and Ian also had a brilliant start netting eleven shots before allowing the Barham lads to get on the scoreboard. Unfortunately, once their opponents got the feel for the greens they became more dynamic and accurate. The promising win dwindled to a tied match, 21-21, as they took the last four ends with multiple numbers. Thankfully, Lionel, playing with Carmen, Greg and Glenn, had a more successful day with the Skip, Lionel, producing some bowling gems time and time again. Once they got into action they maintained enormous pressure and only allowed the Barham folk to score single shots on any end they won. This resulted in a mammoth 27-9 tally which was sufficient to get the whole side over the line for a 66 – 51 victory, and allow them to have another dip into the bag of Freddo Frogs. Yay! We are still on top of the ladder – after two rounds of match play!

**Division 3** fronted up to the folk from Kerang Golf and really took the match up to their strong opponents. Having to field one rink a player short for half the match did them no favours, as this reduced their number of possible shots they could score. However, this very rink with Tony B (Skip), Maurie and George, and later including Terry S., did themselves proud as they won 24 shots to 18. It was a tight affair

A slight easing of the pedal on the last two ends saw them gift 6 shots to their opponents, otherwise they would have been the Frog winners! Apparently, on one end, Bill sent down a rocket which took out four opposing bowls in one shot to gather a handy score for themselves. It was a tough initiation for Chester in his first game of Pennant, but he can take heart from the encouraging words of his Skip who claimed that he improved immensely as the nerves wore off and he settled into the game. They managed to break into double figures thanks to a tidy last three ends and finished 10 -27 in arrears. The final overall tally 51- 65 was a fine effort and not to be sneezed at. Great work, Division 3, under trying conditions. We are proud of you and your attitude to playing.

Place your name on the jobs roster – those who don't volunteer will be given a job.



After the ceremony, you are invited, we will have a BBQ so that people can have a chat.



# Past Press 21 June 1985

Press Panel is back from its extended holiday in the Bahamas, rumour has it the more than 6 seniors trained for Pyramid this week, Paddy Dingwall cleaned his boots last night and C.U.B. orders have doubled for the week - yes, you guessed it folks, the NDFL has finally found its draw and there is a game of footy on the weekend - we kid you not!

We have had our well known spy 'The Tout' out and about the traps during the last two weeks to see what bits of football trivia he may be able to dredge up, to help the panel pick a winner in the game between Pyramid and Leitchville. Mrs. Umpy and her mother in law have been somewhat unreliable in recent weeks - we bailed 'The Tout' out and set him on his way. Unfortunately, he didn't make it past the big red building on the corner and we are none the wiser - which is the way we make all of our other predictions.


