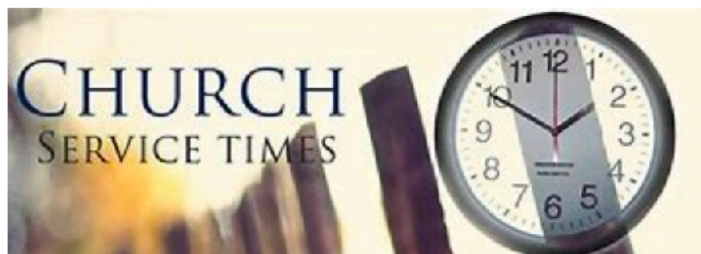

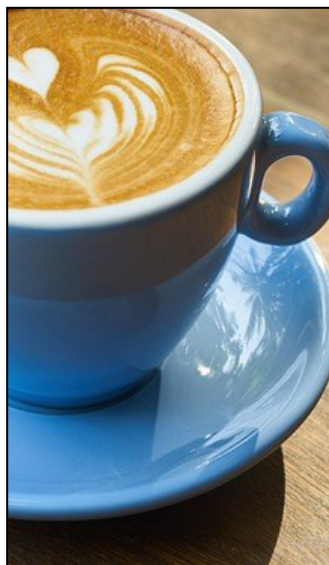

Doors Open on Op Shop

The Pyramid Hill Finders Keepers Op Shop officially opened its doors last Sunday. The volunteers prepared for weeks tidying the venue, gaining a planning permit and moving furniture and receiving donations.

More than 80 people turned out for the event, free sausage and hand-made biscuits, baked and decorated by Pyramid Hill College students. Finders Keepers is housed rent-free in the shed at the side of the Pyramid Hill Supermarket, a generous donation from the owner, Mandeep Singh. The shop sells larger items like furniture, white goods, tools, electrical goods in working order and one-off oddities like a dentist chair, tripod, stained glass panels and a wicker commode.

Bowls Notes



Another week done and dusted. Before we know it we will be into the Christmas break!

Mid-Week Pennant: For the **Red Team** it was a case of “Half Yours” and Half Ours since they worked all morning only to dash to the designated goal line with a dead heat, photo finish. No count back required and no deliberation by the judges to be taken into account. One rink finished 14 shots down, the other rink finished 14 shots up. Jan playing Skip, with Joe as Third, Kate as Second and Rose as Lead, got sorely bogged down in the trenches and sat on the number 7 for nine consecutive ends. It didn’t matter what they did, how good their own shots were, the opposing Skip wreaked havoc. As good fortune would have it Jan’s rink pulled themselves together and scored some handy shots on the last two ends to make a dramatic difference to the whole match and tie up the overall score. Their tally 11-25 was a blessing though, sadly, we have no control over the ability and skill of others, especially not our opponents. On the other rink, Marie N. as Skip with Carmen, Ian and Glen started strongly and kept up their momentum throughout winning two thirds of the twenty-one available ends. Despite only scoring a four on one end, the remainder of the ends were a majority of respectable twos which built up their tally nicely and regularly. They completed the match 27 to 13 shots up which counteracted the loss of the other rink and earned themselves the Freddo Frog Award again. It was a bit frustrating playing a draw, but it’s better than a loss, however the sharing of the points caused a downward slip on the rungs of the ladder – now in 6th place.

The **Blue Team** travelled to Barham where they experienced the fast synthetic green. Obviously, Tony (Skip), playing with substitute player, Gary W., and George and Maurie were still in the same rut as the previous Saturday as they found adding to their total quite an elusive thing to do. On the up-side, they restricted their opposition bowlers to mostly ones and twos which kept them in the game and gave them some hope. The 6-26 loss looks a bit dire on paper but the end shots indicate a better competition was enjoyed. Terry (Skip), Bill, Anthony and Michael really put the wind up their opponents but, by handing out two ends with five and one end with seven, they cut off their own legs at the knees. Apparently they took good notice of what to do as they scored a five on one end themselves. Such high scores really puts the cat among the pigeons and it is hard work to peg the shots

back. Anthony and Michael earned the praise of the Skip for their good play which gives them encouragement to keep turning up and keep trying. Their loss by just seven shots meant the overall tally amounted to 28-55 in favour of Barham.

Saturday Pennant

I’ve said it before and I say it again. Mother Nature, or “somebody up there”, is not in favour of us playing bowls or at least obviously thinks that rolling a sphere with an inserted bias on a grassy surface and expecting it to stop in a precise spot is not challenge enough in itself! Really??!! We could do without the wind! Saturday’s wind was horrific – more than a challenge! Some say that the wind doesn’t affect the bowls – well, come along and have a look at how the bowls rolled at the weekend. Where they stopped was anyone’s guess, and what line they took to get there was a spectacle to behold.

Division 2: We were hopeful that during the road trip to Wakool the gale might have lessened a little but that was a futile hope. The icy gusts of wind played their own games as they swirled around the shrubbery and ducked around the corners of buildings. Was it best to play long ends or short ends, play into the cross wind or tender with the wind? It was all a conjecturing game and what worked once did not necessarily mean it would work again. All we could take from it was that the conditions were the same for both sides, it was just going to be a matter of who handled the greens and the turbines the best. And so it was a tussle that lasted all day, no easing up even during the welcomed lunch break. Jan (Skip), Jean, Kate and Rose won their first end with a handy three shot haul but never really found their groove after that despite winning just short of half the twenty-one ends. They packed away their bowls falling to a 14-22 loss. Lionel (Skip) with Carmen, David and Glen also took early points and pretty much stood toe-to-toe until the last two ends when they conceded five shots leaving them six shots in arrears, 14-20. Well what would you expect when one player, who shall remain nameless unless you tie the clues back to the Skip, turned up minus his bowls shoes??!! It is only natural that things were a bit off balance and out of sync. (One can not expect to get away with that faux pas without scoring a ribbing!) To top it off, there they were front and centre on the Live Stream Rink broadcast right across the land, in fact the country –

even the world - show casing their skills; and didn't our Club uniform look brilliant on TV?! You can scroll through the YouTube channel to see them in action and to lay witness to the brilliant shots that brought them undone. Luckily those shoes were in matching tones! ☺ ☺ Thankfully, Marie S. (Skip), Marie N., Terry and Ian were able to steady the ship and avoid a clean sweep of the board. It took some time to decide that it was safer to allow the wind to draw the bowls into the head than it was to battle the route against the gales, but once they worked this out, they scored nine shots over two ends and set their sights for the winning finishing line. It was a juggle to determine the pace and at which moment the bowl might be blown at right angles. They were four shots up at the break and failed to make any further headway after refuelling. It was a good team effort with everyone contributing to the Freddo Frog Award win 20-16. Overall, however, there was not the same level of joy as this amounted to our first defeat for the season and seriously impacted our hold on top spot which is looking a bit precarious over second placed Wakool by just five points. Only adding two premiership points for the day has left us looking a bit vulnerable.

Division 3: headed to Cohuna Golf with new bowler, Lyn, added to their list. The winds were just as damaging to the games there, so it was a shame Lyn had to encounter such a trial on her first day out. However, it's a sad fact that most Wednesdays and Saturdays are designated as days to reckon with the elements. Up against the combined Gunny Golf side, Tony (Skip) with Maurie, George and new recruit Lyn put up a pretty good fight. The guys had been given the low-down about taking care of their new player and I believe they accommodated the advice pretty well, even showing her how easy it is to donate a couple of ends to the value of five along the way. Their tally at the end was a respectable loss by five shots (13-18), so they showed that they could hold their own in trying conditions. Tony ruefully admitted that one set of five was due to his heavy handedness. Greg (Skip), Mari, Anthony and Michael seemed to relish the conditions, at least to a better degree. Somehow we really have to hammer home the point that gifting five shots on an end makes winning more difficult. They managed to do this on two occasions as well as throw in a four into the mix. Had those numbers been different their result would have been significantly altered as they won more than half the ends played and only finished one shot down 21-22. A very good effort regardless. Joe (Skip) with Bill, Amy and Chester weren't satisfied with donating fives – they bestowed a couple of sixes and even a seven to their opponents which was disappointing after starting so well. The appeal of

gaining seven shots in one end must have truly inspired the Gunny Golf folk as there was no stopping their momentum after that little treat. The final score 11-35 in Gunny Golf's favour totalled to an overall defeat 43- 75. Division 3 are snugly tucked into last place on the ladder – but someone has to be there and they are doing it well.

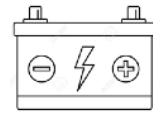
