● Canberra Camp Experience



From November 10 to 14, Year 5 and 6 students had an amazing camp in Canberra, filled with fun and engaging activities. Here are the highlights of their escapade:

- National Archives: Students learnt about the Constitution.
- National Arboretum: They explored the area through orienteering.
- Australian Institute of Sport (AIS): A tour included a visit to the simulation room.
- High Court: Students observed judges in action and gained insight into Australia's judicial system.

In addition, PHC students visited two significant sites:

- Parliament House: Here, students role-played scenarios in the House of Representatives and the Senate, followed by a tour to discover its rich history.
- Old Parliament and Australian War Memorial: They explored various exhibits and learned about soldiers from World War I and World War II. During this visit, Xanthe had the privilege of reading from a diary belonging to a family member who served in World War I.

This experience truly enriched students' understanding of Australia's history and governance leaving them inspired and eager to learn more.

It was another day when both Divisions graced our greens as we welcomed players from Barham and Cohuna. We are blessed this season to have the favourable draw of both sides at home and both side away. It makes it so much more companionable as we can see each other in action and socialise together after the matches are completed. This time around we just enjoyed some nibbles and drinks due to the need to consider those involved with hosting the "Any Combination Fours" tournament the following day.

Division 3: were pitted against the Barham #5 side and equipped themselves very well. Tony (Skip), Maurie, Lyn and George found score making challenging but they redeemed themselves somewhat with a handy three shots on their very last end to allow them to record a number higher than 10. It's always ego building to get to double figures at least. The conversation of the around-the-table analysis, laced with a few drinks at the end of the day, included reference to the fact that Lyn, who was only in her second game of Pennant, "will make a very good player." Good praise from the Oracle. Perhaps they were thrown a bit off balance due to Chester being recruited as a sub by the opposition. He also was complimented for his developing skills. It's a good omen for the future when we have new players being recognised so positively. The final score for their match was 12-25 but, with the new bowlers getting into the groove and gaining confidence, there is every indication that the results of upcoming matches could be much closer. Greg (Skip) to Anthony, Mari and Michael was so close to pulling off a nail-biter. Their match was all tied up going into the last end with fifteen shots apiece. It was a bit of a travesty that they couldn't claim the last end as they were on a roll winning the five previous ends. However, they can lay claim to having won the majority of the ends despite losing 15-16. Joe at the helm with Bill, Amy and Jasmine were in great form and almost achieved a drought breaker by scoring enough shots to cover the other two rinks. (It didn't happen but it nearly did.) They were inspired mid-match by a miraculous shot by Joe which saw him steal the jack from the opposition to give his own team a three shot advantage. At interview two days later, Joe couldn't quite recall the details of the incident despite being buoyed at the time. There could be several theories about that; unlike golfers, bowlers are not inclined to replay every bowl after the game, it happens so often it has become a "ho-hum" event, or Alzheimer's has set in and

They plied away steadily all day but just couldn't claim the lead despite being tied at thirteen each on the seventeenth end. The loss of the last four ends saw them go down by six shots. Fortunately the other two rinks were able to attain victories to amass an overall conquest. Marie S, in charge of Marie N. Terry and Ian got away to a flying start but they relinquished this good effort by gifting an end of five shots just before the lunch break which saw the scores tie up at twelve all on the twelfth end. After that little scare it became a battle for supremacy as the end -or-end tussle indicated the evenness of the game. Pyramid Hill coming out winners due to the accumulation of multiple tallies in comparison to Cohuna only being able to add single shots each end they won. It was a bit of a relief to finish four shots to the better, 22-18.

The team deserving the greatest accolades for the day was the one with Jan (Skip), Jean, Kate and Rose. Throughout the day the praises for good shots was the reward for accurate and consistent bowling with all players contributing. They were on fire -hot, hot, hot! Even though they gave away five shots on one end they retaliated by picking up six shots of their own immediately afterwards. Of the twenty-one ends played they notched up scores on fifteen of them. They were decidedly the best performing rink for the day and picked up the Freddo Frog Award. Well done to them. Not only did they secure the coveted chocolate trophy they also contributed solidly to the 64 -52 triumph. Let the good times roll!

Any Combination Fours Tournament:

Our first tournament for the Season was very successful with the prize winners and runners-up being presented with succulent trays of meat generously donated by our local butcher, Paul Walters. Envy, oh, envy! Thanks so much, Paul. No doubt the meat would cook up just as beautifully as it was presented. The winners were the entry from Dingee and runners-up were from Cohuna. They were the best of the sixteen entered sides including players within our own playing area and from further afield.

Thanks to everyone who helped to make the day run smoothly and successfully. The greens and surrounds looked amazing and drew compliments from many. The catering was outstanding to the extent that one team from Bendigo took photos to demonstrate what can be done in a small community. Obviously the spread would have scored a ten from the MKR judges. We are so blessed to have Kate as our Catering Guru – none can come close to her wherewithal. Helping hands were in abundance – thanks to those who chipped in. Special mention to Jan as Tournament Organiser and Lionel who stepped up in the absence of the President along with Dave as the all-important Bar Manager. Our little Club was beautifully showcased again.



Hi Neighbours




