# Bowls Notes

## Mid-Week Pennant:



We really should be keeping track of the number of bowls days that offer up foul weather. Wednesday was definitely no exception. ## Lizzie's Grandma's Lime Jello Salad.

Then pop whatever mess you've made into a square or rectangular dish to chill in the fridge for at least 4 hours or until someone looks into the fridge on Christmas Day and says "What the hell is this? Can we take it out we need some fridge space!!"




## ● Year 9/10 Driver Education





# Loddon Shire

## Media Releases this week.

Loddon Shire residents have shown a strong commitment to responsible pet ownership and animal welfare and they're now being invited to have their say on Council's draft **Domestic Management Animal Plan 2026-2029 (DAMP)**.

The DAMP has been placed on public display to seek that feedback, having been drafted following extensive community consultation in August 2025.

It is the key document that sets out how Council will meet its legislative responsibilities with regards to the management of domestic animals. While many different animals are kept as pets in our community, the Victorian Domestic Animals Act only covers cats and dogs, and this plan focuses on them too.

Feedback from more than 90 responses during the community consultation demonstrated a strong community commitment to responsible pet ownership and animal welfare.

Most participants reported being aware of their legal obligations regarding pet registration and microchipping, indicating a solid foundation of compliance across the Shire.

Safety and community amenity were recurring themes from our community, with residents expressing concerns about roaming dogs and unowned or feral cats, while recognising Council's role in providing services such as registration, education and trapping programs.

The most consistent themes were:

- high levels of concern about cat-related nuisance (roaming, noise, mess, wildlife impacts); and
- strong support for free or low-cost microchipping and desexing initiatives.

The DAMP recognises Loddon's unique rural context, including its large geographic area, small and dispersed population, and limited local veterinary services.

It reflects the capacity of a small compliance team by focusing on core statutory functions and prioritising practical, achievable actions that can be piloted, evaluated and expanded as resources allow.

Loddon Shire Mayor Dan Straub said he encouraged residents to have their say on the draft DAMP.

"Pets are a major part of our lives and we recognise the positive role they play in our communities," he said. "We also recognise that responsible ownership is essential to protect public amenity, animal welfare and wildlife. "In Loddon, working and assistance animals (including farm dogs and guide dogs) are also part of everyday life and have been considered in how services are delivered."

## Childcare a Priority

The Victorian Election is less than a year away and Loddon Shire Council will be on the front foot advocating for what is best for our communities.

Council will update its priorities document – last updated in September 2024 – ahead of the 2026 State poll.

One of the changes in the document will be that childcare advocacy will be extended to other parts of the Shire, wherever it is needed – previously Council's position is that the northern part of the shire is the most urgent area of need.

Loddon Shire Mayor Dan Straub said updating the priorities document was standard ahead of an election – the last update occurred before the 2025 Federal Election – and Council wanted to ensure it met advocacy priorities, including childcare, heading into the election.

"Council is neither a provider nor decision maker for childcare and our commitment is to see fair access for everyone in our municipality," he said.

"Council has been a strong advocate for our community in both Spring Street and Canberra and this priorities document will be about ensuring that those in power, or those seeking power, are fully aware of what matters most to our communities."

## Kim's Christmas Salad

To tell you the truth, I am not much of a cook. [I can hear Kate Wood quietly laughing]. But one thing I absolutely love to make in Summer, is this middle eastern inspired salad! It looks very special on the Christmas table, and holds it's own.

It's basically a Fattoush, with diced lettuce, cherry tomatoes, cucumber, sliced radishes, parsley and mint; toast some [in a frypan] Lebanese or pita bread on the side - no need to use oil, just heat it up on both sides on a dry pan. To make it especially delicious you **must add** strawberries and pomegranate seeds.

You can make your own dressing with a blend of fresh lemon juice, \*pomegranate molasses and extra virgin olive oil. \* A balsamic glaze can be swapped out if you can't find pomegranate molasses.. [I wonder if Mandeep will have a rush on pomegranate molasses next week?]

Layer the salad with the prettiest things on top - mint leaves, strawberries, radishes and pomegranate.. and break your toasted pita bread into rough triangles and serve in a bowl on the side. The toasted pita takes the place of traditional croutons, and can be used to scoop up the lovely salad like a fork!
