Over a hundred people attended the fourth annual Pyramid Hill Art Competition on Friday 13 February.


There were 381 entries in the main exhibition and dozens more in the children and youth sections on display in the Supper Room.




The series provides a wonderful opportunity for families, teams and volunteers to enjoy a sport and social catch up in the lead up to the season proper.



**Re: Naming Proposal for unnamed road segment in Pyramid Hill**

Loddon Shire Council is currently undertaking a road naming process for an unnamed road segment in Pyramid Hill as "Appleby Lane", following a submission from the Pyramid Hill & District Historical Society to commemorate the rich history of Albion Richard "Dick" Appleby (1905–1984) in Pyramid Hill. The location of the lane is as indicated on the map, running east from McKay St to Buckley Street.



Council is undertaking community and authority consultation in accordance with the Geographic Names Victoria: Naming rules for places in Victoria (2022).

As a relevant authority, you are invited to review the proposal and provide comments. This consultation ensures the proposed name will not create confusion or operational issues for emergency response, dispatch, or public safety. Any response should include sufficient detail outlining the reasons for either supporting or objecting to the proposed name.


