

Australia Day Honors for Pyramid Hill resident

At the Pyramid Hill Australia Day Ceremony held last week, on a blistering hot 45 degree day, Mayor Dan Straub awarded the Citizen of the Year (Terrick Ward) to our beloved, and admired Helen Stevens.

A lifetime of volunteering has been recognised with the naming of Helen Stevens as Loddon

Shire's Pyramid Hill Ward Citizen of the Year.

Helen's love for history has seen her dedicate the most part of the last 40 years to the Pyramid Hill and District Historical Society, with most of that time as Secretary or Archivist or both. As well as her roles in administration, she has assisted in hosting tours of the Museum, educational visits for local students, researching family histories and writing many publications on different aspects of the local district.

Helen has volunteered in the Pyramid Hill community for most of her adult life and has taken on a variety of committee positions.

She has been an active member of St Thomas Anglican Church Mothers Union, taught Sunday School, and was organist for the Sunday services, as well as Ecumenical gatherings.

In her youth, Helen trained as a nurse and worked at the old Pyramid Hill hospital in the 1950s before marrying local farmer Graeme. She returned to nursing in the 'new' hospital in the 70s, while raising her family. Later on, Helen was a regular visitor at the Bush Nursing Hospital and Aged Care Hostel for many years, playing music for singalongs or just having a cuppa and a chat with residents. She made up special song books for the Hostel residents with all their old favourite sing-a-long titles.

Helen also played the piano or the organ for the annual Anzac services for many years, as well as at many other local events.

She has always loved supporting and encouraging young people and served for several years as a Cub leader.

Eremophila glabra carnosa
Fruit Salad



A low growing form of *Eremophila glabra*, which makes a very easy to care for and tough ground cover plant. Named for the variation of flower colours, from yellow, orange to red, which contrast with the bright green foliage. Flowers throughout the year, and they are highly attractive to nectar feeding birds. Grows around 20cms high but spreads to a couple of metres wide, with the odd arching branch. Likes full sun, will grow in part shade, but the flower colour will be more red with more sunshine. Drought and frost tolerant.

Rhyme Time

Glabra carnosa is a dry region plant that can tolerate Seaspray and light saline ground. The variant *Fruit Salad* has a claim that is valid, King of the *Carnosa's* to be crowned.

Only thirty centimetres high and not a word of a lie, a floral display that is anything but mellow. Orange to Red outside of each flower head and on the inside a vibrant bright Yellow.

Against small leaves so vividly green these flowers they glow or at the very least gleam, as they call out to all nectar feeders. Their arrangement is symbiotic the chirps and buzzes can be hypnotic; their deal doesn't need interceders.

Flowers throughout the year with the most at each end of summer, plant it close to your house it won't create a problem for the plumber.

It'll survive a mild frost without too much cost and drought isn't need for concern. So give it a go, even in pots it will grow, time invested gets a floral return.

Bowls Notes



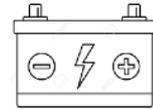
