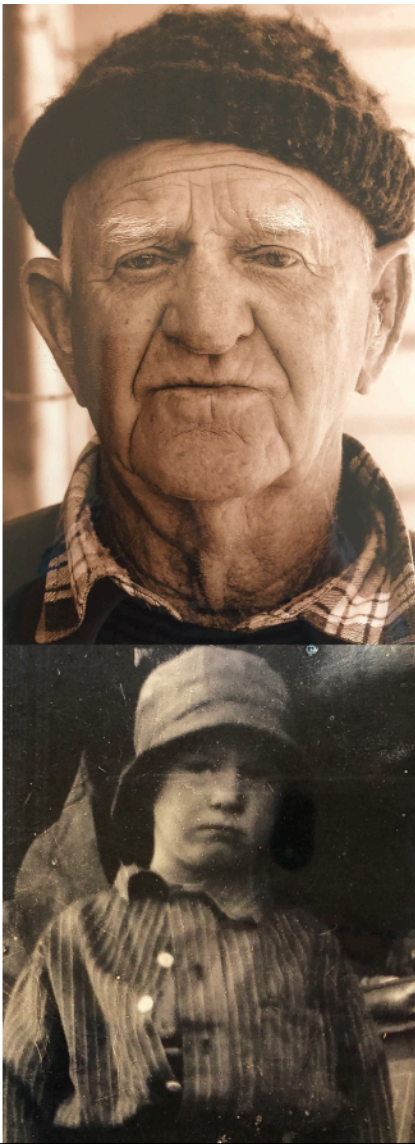

Vale Jack Harrison, 101 strong years.

Three weeks short of his 102nd birthday, Jack passed away peacefully on Tuesday 26 May.

Jack was born in the Pyramid Hill Hospital, the oldest child of Charles and Bessie. He had the honour of living all his life in the same house and bedroom on the family farm, his beloved Hopefield.

Jack loved sport - attending the Olympics in Mexico, Montreal, Munich and Melbourne and many commonwealth games. Locally he achieved accolades for his own golfing and cricketing prowess.

When he turned 18, in 1942, he joined the local chapter of the CFA - offering over 80 years of service and membership receiving the CFA Outstanding Service Medal in 2024.

Jack worked on the farm all his life, many of those travelling long distances on horseback for sheep and cattle work and to irrigate crops. He loved photography, music, his community and above all, his family and Hopefield. He was kind, generous, thoughtful and always wanting to help.

MintBush Majesty

Prostanthera (Mint Bush) are aromatic heavy flowering native shrubs ranging in size from groundcovers to large shrubs.

There are more than 100 different species of Prostanthera in Australia many of which do exceptionally well in the Pyramid Hill Climate.

At Sylvaterre Nursery we currently have 9 of the best Mint Bush species for local gardens.

Round-Leaf Minth Bush / Native Oregano

Fast growing shrub to 1.5m x 1.5m, Frost hardy, drought tolerant, covered in purple flowers during spring/summer

Pink Mint Bush

Pink Mint Bush produces stunning pale to deep mauve flowers, often tinged with purple or blue, that bloom primarily in spring. Frost & Drought tolerant.

Hairy Mint Bush

Spreading shrub, 40cm-2m tall x 2.5m wide. Strongly aromatic foliage. Purple/mauve flowers in spring.

Scarlet Mint Bush-Yellow Variant

Compact shrub to 60cm x 60cm. Yellow tubular flowers in spring. Aromatic foliage. Well-drained soil in full sun or part shade. Drought and frost tolerant.

Balm Mint Bush

A fragrant Victorian native shrub with pink flowers in spring and aromatic foliage. Ideal for borders, pathways, and low to medium screens. 1-2m x 1-2m Frost and Drought tolerant.

Mountain Mint Bush

Small shrub / groundcover up to 50cm x 80cm. White flowers with a mauve centre from September to February. Hardy plant in a well drained semi shaded position. Very showy in flower.

Piggyback Mint Bush

Upright bushy shrub, 1.5-2m high x 1.5m wide. Aromatic, dark green foliage and tubular deep pink flowers from Autumn to spring.

Variegated Mint Bush

Medium-sized shrub to 2m tall x 1.2m wide with aromatic, variegated leaves and purple flowers in spring and summer. Responds well to pruning and suitable for hedges and topiary.

Blotchy Mint Bush

Rare Victorian plant 1-2m x 1m unusual striated flowers from Autumn to Spring. Full sun or part shade in well drained soils. In hot dry districts shade and supplemental water is beneficial in summer.

In pots from \$10 for 125ml (1litre) to \$45 for 250mm (8litres)

Obituary - Arthur Ernest Kerr

Arthur Ernest Kerr was born on the 15th October, 1924, at Yarrowalla to Una and Stanley Kerr. Brother to Clarrie and Don, and later addition, Lorna.

Arthur grew up on the family farm at Canary Island after the family moved north from Gippsland and went to school locally. He had a wonderful childhood growing up with neighbours such the Chalmers, Grieves and Harrison families.

Early on, Arthur developed a passion for motors and could turn his skilful hand to anything needing fixing or building. He purchased a farm south west of Pyramid Hill on Cassidy's Road, whilst he and brother Clarrie also managed and ran the family farm at Canary Island while Don was pursuing a cricketering career in Melbourne.

It was to the Pyramid farm that Arthur brought his new bride Freda Mills from Mincha to reside after their marriage in 1951.

They were progressively blessed with the arrival of three daughters, Cheryl, Pamela and Wendy. Tragedy struck when Pamela, aged 18 months drowned in a farm channel. Arthur, along with Freda and girls, despite their sadness, were actively involved in the Pyramid Hill community, with Arthur playing golf and cricket, all belonging to varying organisations whilst Cheryl and Wendy attended school at Mologa North, Pyramid Hill then Kerang.

Around 1965, they sold the farm and moved to live in Hargeaves St. Bendigo with Arthur working at Nankervis Marine, Eppalock, starting with what was meant as a fill in mechanic position for 2 weeks and ending up staying for over 20 years. He was happy with his work especially rebuilding and hotting up racing engines, not only for boats but some well known efforts were creating racing tractors including *Quamby Quaker* and *Kryptonite*. He even built motors for crop dusters. This complimented his renown love of big, fast cars.

Around 1980, Arthur and Freda purchased a caravan park at Pine Lodge, Shepparton. Following this venture, they took a year to travel and explore Australia with their own caravan. They settled in Cairns where Arthur worked on remote stations in Cape York as a FIFO mechanic. A decade later, they moved to Sydney, where Arthur took up truck driving before eventually retiring to Kerang, then later to Shepparton to be closer to their daughter Wendy.

In their 90s, they moved into care with Freda passing away in 2023. Arthur remained in good health until his death on the 7th April 2026 at Maculata Place, Shepparton, just short of the grand age 101 years and 6 months. Respecting Arthur's wishes that there be no funeral, his ashes along with Freda's, will be interred with Pamela at Pyramid Hill Cemetery at a later date.

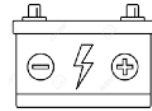
